For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR ARKANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY - BEEBE
10 FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR
11 OTHER PURPOSES."

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

15 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for Arkansas
16 State University - Beebe for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum
17 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions
18 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201
19 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,
20 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set
21 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
22 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
23 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
24 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
25 successor.

28 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for Arkansas
 29 State University - Beebe for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum
 30 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",
 31 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: One hundred nine
 32 (109) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to
 33 exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or
 34 its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

36 SECTION 3. EXTRA HELP - ARKANSAS STATE TECHNICAL INSTITUTE. There

1 is hereby authorized, for Arkansas State University - Beebe - Arkansas State
 2 Technical Institute for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum number of
 3 part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from
 4 funds appropriated herein for such purposes: Fifteen (15) temporary or
 5 part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided
 6 in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this
 7 act for the appropriate classification.

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9 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL REVENUE. There is hereby
 10 appropriated, to Arkansas State University - Beebe, to be payable from the
 11 Arkansas State University - Beebe Fund, for personal services and operating
 12 expenses of Arkansas State University - Beebe for the biennial period ending
 13 June 30, 1993, the following:

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SECTION 8. ADJUNCT AND VISITING PROFESSORS. The Arkansas State University - Beebe shall be exempt from the provisions of Arkansas Code §19-4-1707 to the extent that Arkansas State University - Beebe shall be allowed to hire adjunct professors and visiting professors who are currently providing professional and consulting services to the State of Arkansas, providing that they are not in a position to influence decisions regarding the awarding of grants or contracts, and providing that the term of their employment with Arkansas State University - Beebe does not exceed 25% of that required for a full time employee.

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SECTION 9. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

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1 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
3 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions
6 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
7 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
8 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
9 disbursement of said funds.

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11 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
12 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
13 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
14 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
15 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
16 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
17 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
18 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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20 SECTION 11. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
21 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
22 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

23

24 SECTION 12. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
25 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
26 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
27 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
28 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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30 SECTION 13. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
31 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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33 SECTION 14. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
34 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of
35 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year
36 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the

1 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,
2 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the
3 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm
4 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
5 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
6 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
7 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991
