A BILL ACT 602 OF 1991
SENATE BILL 19

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO CREATE A SPECIAL TEMPORARY COMMITTEE OF THE
9 GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO STUDY THE ORGANIZATION AND STRUCTURE
10 OF THE ARKANSAS STATE POLICE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

14 SECTION 1. There is hereby created a special temporary committee of the
15 General Assembly to be known as the "State Police Study Committee". The
16 committee shall be composed of three House members appointed by the Speaker of
17 the House and three Senate members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
18 the Senate. The committee shall study the organization and structure of the
19 Arkansas State Police, identify ways and means of improving the efficiency and
20 cost effectiveness of the State Police, and report its findings to the General
21 Assembly at its 1993 Regular Session. Members of the committee shall be
22 entitled to per diem and mileage reimbursement for attending committee
23 meetings at the rate prescribed for members of the General Assembly for
24 attending joint interim committee meetings. The per diem and mileage
25 reimbursement shall be paid from funds appropriated for General Assembly
26 members who attend meetings of joint interim committees.

27
28 SECTION 2. The State Police Study Committee created by this Act shall
29 cease to exist on January 18, 1993.

30
31 SECTION 3. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
32 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
33 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

34
35 SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to
36 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect

1 other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
3 Act are declared to be severable.

5 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are
6 hereby repealed.
