(a) Beginning with the 1993-94 school year, only a student 16 who has successfully completed a minimum core of high school courses 17 recommended for preparation for postsecondary education or a more rigorous 18 program of vocational study shall be eligible for the honor of serving as a 19 valedictorian or salutatorian of his or her graduating class. (b) Beginning with the 1993-94 school year, only a student who has 20 21 successfully completed the minimum core of high school courses recommended for 22 preparation for postsecondary education or a more rigorous program of 23 vocational study with a minimum grade point established by the school district 24 or its equivalent shall be eligible for distinction as an honor graduate of a 25 senior class in a high school in this state. (c)(1) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of (a) and (b) above, 26 27 the students must complete the minimum core of courses recommended by the 28 State Board of Higher Education and State Board of Education pursuant to 29 Arkansas Code 6-61-217 enlisted during the period of his enrollment in high 30 school. The State Board of Education shall establish the requirements for a 31 technical preparation which shall include the following: (A) Require students to complete at least three credits each in 32 mathematics and science, with at least two credits in each area from 33 courses with content comparable to that in the college preparatory 34 curriculum. The two higher level math and science courses may be 35 36 courses designed to teach essential content from the college preparatory

Τ	curriculum through an applied or functional instructional process; and
2	(B) Require students to complete at least four credits in a
3	vocational major and two related vocational credits.
4	(2) The State Board of Education shall study the impact of abolishing
5	the general program of studies track in high school and requiring all students
6	thereafter to complete either the college preparatory or technical preparation
7	program of study aimed at preparing youth to continue to learn either in the
8	workplace or in some form of postsecondary institution and report the findings
9	to the Joint Interim Committee on Education by September 15, 1992.
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11	SECTION 2. (a) Beginning with the 1991-92 school year, only a student
12	who is enrolled in a course of study containing the minimum core of high
13	school courses recommended for preparation for postsecondary education as set
14	forth by the State Board of Higher Education and State Board of Education
15	pursuant to Arkansas Code 6-61-217 or the technical preparation program as set
16	forth by the State Board of Education shall be eligible for membership in the
17	National Honor Society or any equivalent academic honor society.
18	(b) A student who is a member of any academic honor society on the
19	effective date of this act shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) above.
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21	SECTION 3. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
22	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
23	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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25	SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to
26	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
27	other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
28	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
29	Act are declared to be severable.
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31	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are
32	hereby repealed.
