17	"AN ACT TO ALLOW DISABLED VOTERS TO ADVANCE IN LINE AT A
18	POLLING PLACE AND TO REQUIRE POLLING PLACES BE ACCESSIBLE

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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 7-5-310 is hereby amended to read as
24	follows:
25	"7-5-310. Privacy - Assistance to disabled.
26	(a) Each voter shall be provided the privacy to mark his or her ballot.
27	Privacy shall be provided by the County Board of Election Commissioners to
28	insure that voters desiring privacy are not singled out.
29	(b) If a voter informs the judges that he is unable to mark his ballot
30	because he cannot read or write or because of physical, sensory, or other
31	disability or other legal cause, such person may be assisted by two (2)
32	election judges or by a person selected by the voter, who shall mark the
33	ballot so as to vote the ballot in accordance with the voter's wishes.
34	(c) Any voter because of physical, sensory, or other disability who
35	presents himself or herself for voting and who then informs the election
36	sheriff of each polling place that he or she is unable to stand in line for

1 extended periods of time shall be entitled to and assisted by the election 2 sheriff to advance to the head of any line of voters then waiting in line to 3 vote at the polling place. This section shall become null and void on January 4 1, 1995." SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-5-523 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: "7-5-523. Assistance to disabled voters. R (a) If the voter is unable, because of physical, sensory, or other 9 10 disability, or other legal cause, to cast his ballot by voting machine and 11 needs the assistance of some other person in casting his ballot, that voter 12 may be assisted by two (2) election judges, or by a person selected by the 13 voter, who shall operate the machine so as to vote the ballot in accordance 14 with the voter's wishes, and shall be permitted to keep the curtain of the 15 machine closed no longer than five (5) minutes. The laws of this state with 16 respect to assisting persons with disabilities in the casting of votes upon 17 printed ballots shall govern, insofar as is practicable, the assistance of a 18 voter in casting his ballot by voting machine. (b) Any voter because of physical, sensory, or other disability who 19 20 presents himself or herself for voting by voting machine and who then informs 21 the presiding election election sheriff of each polling place that he or she 22 is unable to stand in line for extended periods of time shall be entitled to 23 and assisted by the election sheriff to advance to the head of any line of 24 voters then waiting in line to vote at the polling place. This section shall 25 become null and void on January 1, 1995." 26 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 7-5-311 is hereby amended to read as 2.7 28 follows: "7-5-311. Disabled voters - Special procedures. 29 The county boards of election commissioners and the county 30 31 committees of the respective political parties with respect to general, 32 special, and primary elections under their several jurisdictions shall provide 33 voting locations which are accessible to disabled voters and shall provide

34 reasonable and adequate methods whereby disabled voters may personally and

35 secretly execute their ballots at the polling places.

- (b) The State Board of Election Commissioners, after conferring with
- 2 and obtaining the assistance of disabled persons or organizations of disabled
- 3 citizens, shall promulgate rules and regulations for special procedures to be
- 4 followed by election officials at voting precincts that will assist in
- 5 accommodating voting by disabled voters. The regulations shall include, but
- 6 are not limited to, the promulgation of the form of a special ballot, which
- 7 reasonably complies with the form of the paper ballot now provided by law, to
- 8 be used by visually impaired or disabled voters in executing their ballot.
- 9 Such special ballots may be used at voting places in lawful elections in this
- 10 state in lieu of voting by voting machine, electronic voting device, or the
- 11 regular paper ballot, when requested by the disabled person, if suitable
- 12 accommodations are not provided whereby voters may cast their votes in secret
- 13 except by the use of the special ballot.
- 14 (c) All rules, regulations, and procedures authorized by the State
- 15 Board of Election Commissioners to enable disabled persons to vote shall be
- 16 designed to permit the voter to personally and secretly execute his ballot
- 17 without the assistance of a third party unless third-party assistance is
- 18 requested by the disabled voter.
- 19 (d) As used in this section, the term disabled voter shall mean the
- 20 visually impaired and persons with physical or mental disabilities, but who
- 21 are legally competent to vote in lawful elections in this state.
- 22 (e)(1) The county board of election commissioners shall be responsible
- 23 for compliance with this section and with Public Law 98-435 and title II of
- 24 Public Law 101-336, the Americans with Disabilities Act regarding the
- 25 accessibility of voting locations for disabled voters, except that county
- 26 political parties shall be responsible for compliance with this section and
- 27 with Public Law 98-435 for primary elections.
- 28 (2) The Secretary of State shall provide the chairman of each
- 29 county board of election commissioners and the chairman of each county
- 30 political party a copy of this section and Public Law 98-435.
- 31 (3) The Secretary of State shall send the copies by certified
- 32 mail.

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- 34 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of general and permanent nature
- 35 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code

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1 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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         SECTION 5. If any provisions of this act or the application thereof to
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 4 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect
 5 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
 6 the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 7 act are declared to be severable.
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         SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
10 hereby repealed.
