19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. Effective July 1, 2001, the annual salaries of court
22 reporters and case coordinators shall be paid in twenty-four (24) equal semi -
23 monthly installments.
24

25 SECTION 2. Emergency Clause. It is found and determined by the General
26 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that because of Act 51 of 1967, court
27 reporters and case coordinators have been paid on a monthly basis, when the
28 vast majority of all other state employees are paid on a semi-monthly or bi -
29 weekly basis. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
30 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
31 safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If
32 the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
33 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
34 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
35 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
36 veto. APPROVED: BECAME LAW ON 4/5/2001, WITHOUT THE GOVERNOR'S SIGNATURE.
