15 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS
16 AT MONTICELLO APPROPRIATION FOR THE
17 2001-2003 BIENNIUM.
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
24 the University of Arkansas at Monticello for the 2001-2003 biennium, the
25 following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed
26 by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas
27 Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
28 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary
29 is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said
30 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
31 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
32 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
33 successor.

SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the University of Arkansas at Monticello for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: seven hundred ninety (790) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas at Monticello, to be payable from the University of Arkansas at Monticello Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the University of Arkansas at Monticello for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

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36 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE

1 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Arkansas Code
 2 Annotated 26-58-124(b)(2)(A)(ii) is hereby amended to read as follows: "(ii)
 3 The next three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) or so much thereof as
 4 may be collected in severance taxes, penalties, and costs on timber and timber
 5 products, over and above the amount distributed to the State Forestry Fund
 6 during each fiscal year as provided in subdivision (b)(2)(A)(i) of this
 7 section, shall be distributed and credited to the University of Arkansas at
 8 Monticello Fund. The University of Arkansas at Monticello may transfer from
 9 General Revenue to cash funds any timber severance tax funds as provided in
 10 Arkansas Code 26-58-124 subdivision (b)(2)(A)(ii), to be set aside therein to
 11 be used solely and exclusively for providing additional support for the School
 12 of Forestry of the University of Arkansas at Monticello, as per the intent of
 13 Arkansas Code 26-58-124 subdivision (b)(2)(A)(ii); and"

14
 15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
 16 through June 30, 2003.

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 18 SECTION 6. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
 19 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For all
 20 appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall
 21 monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly
 22 basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to
 23 less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, the
 24 disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the agency.

25 Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
 26 head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
 27 State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
 28 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
 29 include the following:

- 30 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
 31 expenditures on the fund balance.
- 32 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or
 33 any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
- 34 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
 35 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
- 36 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not

1 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
 2 depletion of the fund balance.

3 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
 4 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request , after having sought
 5 prior review by the Legislative Council.

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 7 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by
 8 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made
 9 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions
 10 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures
 11 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and
 12 Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their
 13 successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and
 14 regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as
 15 authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said
 16 funds.

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 18 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 20 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
 21 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
 22 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
 23 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
 24 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
 25 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

26
 27 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
 28 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
 29 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
 30 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of the
 31 agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the
 32 event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date
 33 of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper
 34 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an
 35 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
 36 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full

1 force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
