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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 20-57-204(d)(2) is amended to read as follows:
23 (2) On and after July 1, ~~2004~~ 2005, the fee provisions as set
24 forth in this subsection (d) shall be null and void, and any food service
25 establishment may obtain a food service permit by meeting the minimum
26 requirements established by the applicable rules and regulations.
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28 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
29 Assembly that the food service permit fee supports the food service program of
30 the Department of Health; that the program provides food safety training for
31 food inspectors and industry personnel; that the present permit fee expires on
32 July 1, 2001; that the permit fee should be continued in effect in order to
33 provide funding for the food service program of the Department of Health; and
34 that unless this emergency clause is adopted this act will not become
35 effective until after July 1, 2005. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
36 exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the

1 public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its
2 approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
3 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
4 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the
5 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the
6 last house overrides the veto.
