13 BOARD; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
23

24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-81-1201 is amended to read as follows:  
25 6-81-1201. Definitions.

26 As used in this subchapter:

27 (1) "Arkansas Department of Public Health" means any of Arkansas'  
28 public health units;

29 ~~(1)(2)~~ "Arkansas school of nursing" means any school or school's  
30 department of nursing located in ~~Arkansas' universities or colleges~~ Arkansas;

31 ~~(2)(3)~~ "Board" means the ~~Arkansas Primary Care Nursing Practice and~~  
32 ~~Nurse Educator Student Loan and Scholarship Board~~ Graduate Nursing Student  
33 Loan and Scholarship Board;

34 (4) "Master's or doctoral nursing education program" means Arkansas  
35 nursing education programs located in an Arkansas public or private  
36 institution of higher education that has a master's nursing program

1 accredited by a recognized national nursing accreditation organization or a  
2 Doctor of Philosophy in nursing program accredited by North Central  
3 Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

4 ~~(3)(5)~~ "Nurse educator" means a student enrolled in an Arkansas  
5 master's nursing education program or doctoral nursing education program who  
6 will prepare to teach nursing in ~~one of Arkansas' nursing schools or~~  
7 ~~departments of nursing in higher education~~ an Arkansas school of nursing;

8 ~~(4)(6)(A)~~ "Primary care nursing" means advanced nursing care provided  
9 in one (1) of the following areas of practice:

- 10 ~~(A)(i)~~ Family practice nursing;
- 11 ~~(B)(ii)~~ Pediatric nursing;
- 12 ~~(C)(iii)~~ Women's health nursing;
- 13 ~~(D)(iv)~~ Nurse midwifery;
- 14 ~~(E)(v)~~ Gerontology nursing; ~~and~~
- 15 ~~(F)(vi)~~ Adult nursing; and

16 (B) Primary care nursing occurs in the context of the community  
17 and is characterized by long-term, close relationships between the  
18 practitioner and patient, in which the primary care provider treats common  
19 and episodic illness, but refers more complex problems to specialists;

20 ~~(5)(7)~~ "Rural community" means a community within a health professions  
21 shortage area, as determined by the board, or a community having a population  
22 of no more than fifteen thousand (15,000) persons according to the most  
23 recent federal census taken prior to the execution of the loan contract or  
24 the most recent federal census taken prior to the time the recipient of the  
25 loan or loans shall be required to practice full time in such a rural  
26 community as provided in §§ 6-81-1204 and 6-81-1206.

28 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 6-81-1202 is amended to read as follows:

29 6-81-1202. ~~Arkansas Primary Care Nursing Practice and Nurse Educator~~  
30 ~~Student Loan and Scholarship Board~~ Graduate Nurse Educator Loan and  
31 Scholarship Board.

32 (a) There is established the ~~Arkansas Primary Care Nursing Practice~~  
33 ~~and Nurse Educator Student Loan and Scholarship Board~~ Graduate Nurse Educator  
34 Loan and Scholarship Board composed of:

- 35 (1) The dean, chair, or director of each of the accredited
- 36 graduate nursing programs in the state that offers a nurse practitioner

2 of nursing;

3 (2) Prescribe forms for and regulate the submission of  
4 applications for financial assistance;

5 (3) Determine eligibility of applicants;

6 (4) Allow or disallow applications for financial assistance;

7 (5) Contract, increase, decrease, terminate, and otherwise  
8 regulate all grants for this purpose and receipt for their repayment and  
9 convert loans to scholarships;

10 (6) Manage, operate, and control all funds and property  
11 appropriated or otherwise contributed for this purpose;

12 (7) Accept gifts, grants, bequests, or devises and apply them as  
13 a part of this program;

14 (8) Sue and be sued as the board; and

15 (9) Accept moneys from federal programs which may be used for

23 (a) The board may make rural advanced nursing practice or nurse  
24 educator loans to an applicant, each rural advanced nursing practice or nurse  
25 educator loan being expressly made subject to the provisions of § 6-81-1204  
26 if it finds that:

27 (1) The applicant is a bona fide resident of Arkansas;

28 (2) The applicant has been accepted for admission to, or is  
29 enrolled in good standing in, an accredited ~~graduate primary care nurse~~  
30 ~~practitioner or master's nurse~~ educator, master's nurse practitioner, or  
31 Doctor of Philosophy in nursing program in the state leading to a graduate  
32 degree in nursing;

33 (3) The applicant is or will be a full-time graduate nursing  
34 student or a part-time student who is employed full-time in an Arkansas  
35 school of nursing;

36 (4) The applicant needs financial assistance to complete his or

29 (a)(1)(A) The maximum amount of each master's rural *advanced* nursing  
30 practice or nurse educator loan for full-time applicants shall not exceed  
31 eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) per academic year.

32 (B) The maximum amount of each Doctor of Philosophy in  
33 nursing loan for full-time applicants shall not exceed twenty thousand  
34 dollars (\$20,000) per academic year.

35 (C) Loans for part-time applicant shall be pro-rated as  
36 determined by the board.

1           (2)(A) The maximum number of years a master's recipient may  
 2 receive funding shall not exceed two (2) years or four (4) regular academic  
 3 semesters of full-time enrollment or four (4) years or eight (8) regular  
 4 academic semesters of part-time enrollment.

5           (B) The maximum number of years a doctoral recipient may receive

12 received, together with interest at the maximum rate allowed by law from the  
13 date of receipt of the funds.

14  
15 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 81, Subchapter 12 is amended  
16 to add an additional section to read as follows:

17 6-81-1209. Effect of subchapter.

18 Nothing in this subchapter shall be construed as establishing minimal  
19 requirements for schools of nursing or otherwise affecting the powers and  
20 duties of the Arkansas State Board of Nursing regarding schools of nursing.
