This member shall be appointed from a list of not more than three (3) names presented by the Arkansas State Nurses Association;
- 29 (5) One (1) member shall be a regularly licensed pharmacist who 30 shall have been actively engaged in the practice of pharmacy for at least 31 seven (7) years preceding his appointment. This member shall be appointed 32 from a list of not fewer than three (3) names presented by the Arkansas 33 Pharmacists Association;
- 34 (6) One (1) member shall be a regularly licensed veterinarian 35 who shall have been actively engaged in the practice of veterinary medicine 36 for at least seven (7) years preceding his appointment. This member shall be

- 1 appointed from a list of not fewer than three (3) names presented by the
- 2 Arkansas Veterinary Medical Association;
- 3 (7) One (1) member shall be a registered sanitarian who shall
