Arkansas Code § 6-23-302(c)(1)(C), concerning the petition 8 for an open-enrollment charter school, is amended to read as follows: 9 (C)(i) Within seven (7) calendar days following the first publication of notice required under subdivision (c)(1)(B) of this section, 10 11 letters announcing the public hearing shall be sent to the superintendents and school board members of each of the school districts from which the 12 charter school is likely to draw students for the purpose of enrollment and 13 14 the superintendents and school board members of any district that is 15 contiguous to the district in which the open-enrollment charter school will 16 be located. 17 (ii) The letters to the school board members required in subdivision (c)(1)(C)(i) shall only be required for each school 18 19 board members member whose name and mailing address are provided by the superintendent of an affected school district or the Department of Education 20 21 upon the request of the petitioner; 22 23 SECTION 8. Arkansas Code  $\S$  6-23-304(b) through (c), concerning 24 preference for charter schools in certain school districts, is amended to read as follows: 25 26 (b) The state board shall give preference in approving an 27 application for a charter school to be located in any public school district: 28 (1) Where the percentage of students who qualify for free or 29 reduced price lunches is above the average for the state; or 30 (2) Where the percentage of students not reading at grade level is above the average for the state district has been classified by the State 31 32 Board as in academic distress under § 6-15-428; or 33 (3) Where the district has been classified by the Department of 34 Education as showing the greatest need for school improvement under § 6-15-35 426. 36 (c)(1) The state board and may grant no more than a total of twelve

- 20 After the initial three year five-year period of an open-enrollment
- 21 charter, the State Board of Education is authorized to renew these charters
- 22 on a one-year or multiyear basis, not to exceed three (3) years per each
- 23 charter renewal five (5) years.
- 24 SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 6-23-402 is amended to read as follows:

6	the amount that a public school would receive under $\S$ 6-20-2005(a) and (b) $\S$
7	6-20-2305(a) and (b) as well as any other funding that a charter school is
8	entitled to receive under law or pursuant to rules promulgated by the State
9	Board of Education.
10	(2) Funding for an open-enrollment charter school shall be based
11	upon the current year three-quarter average daily membership of the open-
12	enrollment charter school as follows:
13	(A) The initial funding estimate for each school year
14	shall be based on enrollment as of $\frac{April + 15}{2}$ July 1 preceding the school year
15	in which the students are to attend;
16	(B) In December, funding will be adjusted based on the
17	first quarter average daily membership; and
18	(C) A final adjustment will be made after the current year
19	three-quarter average daily membership is established.
20	(3) Funding for an open-enrollment charter school shall be paid
21	in twelve (12) equal installments each fiscal year.

23	SECTION 12. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-23-601(a)(3), concerning petitions for
24	limited charter school status, is amended to read as follows:
25	(3) A limited charter shall be initially established for a
26	period of no more than three (3) five (5) years and may be renewed on a one-
27	year or multiyear basis, not to exceed three (3) five (5) years per charter
28	renewal.
