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AN ACT TO CLARIFY ELIGIBILITY FOR AND
17 SERVICE ON THE ARKANSAS STATE MEDICAL
18 BOARD.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-95-202 is amended to read as follows:
24 17-95-202. Definitions.

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As used in the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, §§ 17-95-201 - 17-95-
26 207, 17-95-301 - 17-95-305, and 17-95-401 - 17-95-411, unless the context
27 otherwise requires:

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(1) "Active" means a physician actively engaged in the full-time
29 practice of medicine;

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~~(1)~~(2) "Board" means the Arkansas State Medical Board; and

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~~(2)~~(3) "Practice of medicine" means:

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(A) Holding out one's self to the public within this state
33 as being able to diagnose, treat, prescribe for, palliate, or prevent any
34 human disease, ailment, injury, deformity, or physical or mental condition,
35 whether by the use of drugs, surgery, manipulation, electricity, or any



1 physical, mechanical, or other means whatsoever;

2 (B) Suggesting, recommending, prescribing, or
3 administering any form of treatment, operation, or healing for the intended
4 palliation, relief, or cure of any physical or mental disease, ailment,
5 injury, condition, or defect of any person with the intention of receiving,
6 either directly or indirectly, any fee, gift, or compensation whatsoever;

7 (C) Maintaining an office or other place to meet persons
8 for the purpose of examining or treating persons afflicted with disease,
9 injury, or defect of body or mind;

10 (D) Using the title "M.D.", "M.B.", "D.O.", "physician",
11 "surgeon", or any other word or abbreviation to indicate or induce others to
12 believe that one is engaged in the diagnosis or treatment of persons
13 afflicted with disease, injury, or defect of body or mind, except as
14 otherwise expressly permitted by the laws of this state relating to the
15 practice of any limited field of the healing arts; or

16 (E) Performing any kind of surgical operation upon a human
17 being.

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19 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-95-301(b)(1) and (2), concerning the
20 creation and membership of the Arkansas State Medical Board, are amended to
21 read as follows:

22 (b)(1)(A) The board shall consist of thirteen (13) members appointed
23 by the Governor for terms of ~~eight (8)~~ six (6) years.

24 (B) The Governor shall consider diversity of practice
25 specialties and geographical areas of practice in making appointments to the
26 board.

27 (2)(A)(i) *Nine (9) members shall be duly qualified, licensed,*
28 *and active medical practitioners and appointed upon the advice and*
29 *recommendation of the Arkansas Medical Society.*

30 (ii) One (1) member *At least two (2) members shall*
31 *be appointed from each of the* ~~six (6)~~ state's four (4) *congressional*
32 *districts established by Acts 1951, No. 297 [repealed].*

33 (iii) Three (3) members *One (1) member shall be*
34 *appointed at large.*

35 (B) Congressional district representation required under
36 this subdivision (b)(2) shall be achieved by appointment as vacancies occur.

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2 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-95-301(c), concerning the terms of
3 membership on the Arkansas State Medical Board, is amended to read as
4 follows:

5 (c)(1) The term of each member shall expire on December 31 of the year
6 designated, and a successor appointee shall be named by the Governor on or
7 before the expiration date of the term so expiring.

8 (2)(A) No member may serve on the board for more than two (2)
9 full terms or more than thirteen (13) years.

10 (B) However, this subdivision (c)(2) shall not cut short a
11 term for which a member is serving on the effective date of this subdivision
12 (c)(2).

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14 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-95-301, concerning the creation and
15 membership of the Arkansas State Medical Board, is amended to add additional
16 subsections to read as follows:

17 “(g) Physicians appointed to the board shall:

18 (1) Remain in active practice for the full term of the
19 appointment; or

20 (2) Resign if, with more than one (1) year remaining on the
21 appointed term, the physician:

22 (A) Is no longer actively practicing as a physician; or

23 (B) Moves his or her business or residence out of the
24 district from which he or she was appointed.

25 (h)(1) Members of the board may be removed from the office by the
26 Governor:

27 (A) For good cause pursuant to § 25-16-804;

28 (B) For cause including dishonorable or unprofessional
29 conduct, abuse of authority, malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance; or

30 (C)(i) For any reason that would justify probation,
31 suspension, or revocation of a physician’s license to practice medicine under
32 the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-401 et seq. which shall be
33 referred directly to the Division of Pharmacy Services and Drug Control of
34 the Department of Health by the Governor for the investigation as provided in
35 § 17-80-106.

36 (ii) The division shall prepare a report for the

1 Governor based on their findings.

2 (2) No member of the board may be involved in the conduct of the
3 investigation except to cooperate with the investigation as required by the
4 investigator.
