EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 31 32 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that applications of soil nutrients 33 have not resulted in excessive nutrient concentrations within the area now 34 excluded from the nutrient surplus area; therefore, persons applying nutrients within that area are no longer required to prepare for pending 35 nutrient management regulation; and that this act is immediately necessary 36
