## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS CIVIL WAR  
10 SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMISSION; AND FOR OTHER  
11 PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

14 AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS CIVIL WAR  
15 SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMISSION.  
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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
19

20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 13 is amended to add a new chapter to  
21 read as follows:

22 13-13-101. Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission.

23 (a) The Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission is created to  
24 assist the Department of Arkansas Heritage in carrying out its duties and  
25 responsibilities as provided in this chapter.

26 (b) The purpose of the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission  
27 is to:

28 (1) Promote a suitable statewide observance of the  
29 sesquicentennial of the Civil War;

30 (2) Cooperate and assist national, state, and local  
31 organizations with programs and activities suitable for the sesquicentennial  
32 observance;

33 (3) Assist in ensuring that any observance of the  
34 sesquicentennial of the Civil War is inclusive and appropriately recognizes  
35 the experiences and points of views of all people affected by the Civil War;

2 (4) Provide assistance for the development of programs,  
3 projects, and activities on the Civil War that have lasting educational  
4 value.

5  
6 13-13-102 Members.

7 (a) The Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission shall consist  
8 of sixteen (16) members. The members shall elect a chair from among the  
9 commission members every four years.

10 (b)(1) The Governor shall appoint four (4) members to serve four-year  
11 terms.

12 (2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the  
13 President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each appoint two (2) members to  
14 serve four-year terms.

15 (c)(1) These persons shall be residents of Arkansas who are recognized  
16 as being learned and interested in the history and the archeology of this  
17 state and who have demonstrated an interest in preserving the cultural  
18 resources of the state.

19 (2) These persons shall also have a background in:

- 20 (A) Arkansas history;
- 21 (B) African-American history; or
- 22 (C) Civil War history.

23 (3)(A) Persons initially appointed by the Governor shall serve  
24 two-year terms. Persons initially appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
25 Representatives shall serve for three-year terms and persons initially  
26 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall serve four-year  
27 terms.

28 (B) Subsequent appointees shall serve four-year terms.

29 (C) Members may be reappointed.

30 (4) The remaining commission membership shall consist of the  
31 following persons or their designees:

- 32 (A) Director of the Department of Arkansas Heritage;
- 33 (B) Director of the Department of Arkansas Parks and  
34 Tourism;
- 35 (C) Director of the Arkansas History Commission;
- 36 (D) Director of the Old State House Museum;

- 1                   (E) President of the Arkansas Historical Association;
- 2                   (F) Director of the Arkansas State Library;
- 3                   (G) Chair of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission; and
- 4                   (H) President of the Arkansas Civil War Heritage Trails
- 5 Foundation.

6                   (5) The following persons shall serve in an advisory capacity:

- 7                   (A) President of the Sons of Confederate Veterans;
- 8                   (B) President of the United Daughters of the Confederacy;
- 9                   (C) Superintendent of the Pea Ridge National Military
- 10 Park; and
- 11                   (D) President of the Sons of Union Veterans.

12                   (d) Members of the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission  
13 shall serve without pay but may receive reimbursement in accordance with §  
14 25-16-902.

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16                   13-13-103. Duties.

17                   The Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission shall have the  
18 following duties:

19                   (1) To plan, develop, and carry out programs and activities  
20 appropriate to commemorate the sesquicentennial of the Civil War era and  
21 encourage the development of programs that ensure that the commemoration  
22 results in a positive legacy and has long-term public benefits;

23                   (2) To encourage interdisciplinary examination of the Civil War;

24                   (3) To facilitate Civil War-related activities throughout the  
25 state;

26                   (4) To encourage civic, historical, educational, economic, and  
27 other organizations across the state to organize and participate in  
28 activities to expand the understanding and appreciation of the significance  
29 of the Civil War;

30                   (5) To coordinate and facilitate the public distribution of  
31 scholarly research, publications, and interpretation of the Civil War; and

32                   (6) To provide technical assistance to local organizations and  
33 nonprofit organizations to further the commemoration of the sesquicentennial  
34 of the Civil War.

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36                   13-13-104. Funding.

1       The General Assembly shall allocate sufficient funding to support the  
2 activities of the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission.

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4       13-13-105. Expiration of Commission.

5       The Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission shall cease to exist  
6 effective December 31, 2015.
