1 State of Arkansas **A BILLACT 796 OF 1991** 2 78th General Assembly SENATE BILL 450 3 Regular Session, 1991 **By: Senator Ross** 6 For An Act To Be Entitled 7 "AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS POISON AND DRUG INFORMATION g CENTER; TO TRANSFER THE POISON CONTROL AND DRUG 9 INFORMATION SYSTEM FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO THE 10 ARKANSAS POISON AND DRUG INFORMATION CENTER; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 12 13 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 15 (a) The General Assembly finds and declares that because of 17 the inherent threat of human danger posed by injudicious use, or misuse, of 18 dangerous substances, Arkansas citizens are in need of emergency poison and 19 drug information services and that the public health and welfare require such 20 services. 21 The General Assembly further finds and declares that legislation is 22 required to authorize and provide effective practical delivery of emergency 23 poison and drug information services judgments and responses to physicians and 24 allied health professionals who deliver health care services within this state 25 and if funds permit, to those citizens of this state who request such 26 services. 27 As used in this act: 28 SECTION 2. (1) "Center" means the Arkansas Poison and Drug Information Center; 29 3 0 "Director" means the Director of the Arkansas Poison and Drug 31 Information Center. 32 33 SECTION 3. There is created the Arkansas Poison and Drug Information 34 Center within the College of Pharmacy of the University of Arkansas for 35 Medical Sciences. The purpose of the center is to implement a statewide

36 emergency poison and drug information program designed and structured to

- 1 deliver reliable, accurate, qualified professional judgments and responses to
- 2 requests for emergency poison and drug information data. The director of the
- 3 center shall serve at the pleasure of the Dean of the College of Pharmacy of
- 4 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

5

- 6 SECTION 4. The director may:
- 7 (1) Employ any and all coordination measures necessary to effectuate 8 the purposes of this act;
- 9 (2) Engage in any educational program or effort if, in his judgment,
- 10 such activity would effectuate the purposes of this act;
- 11 (3) Employ experts and consultants and compensate those individuals at
- 12 rates determined by the director;
- 13 (4) Engage in programs of experimental or demonstrational research;
- 14 (5) Appoint an advisory committee to assist in the development and
- 15 review of regulations promulgated under the authority of this act and
- 16 reimburse the members for their expenses;
- 17 (6) Accept and administer loans, grants, or other funds and gifts,
- 18 conditional or otherwise, from the federal government and any and all other
- 19 public or private sources;
- 20 (7) Formulate, promulgate, adopt, amend, and enforce rules,
- 21 regulations, and regulatory standards necessary to effectuate this act;
- 22 (8) Establish and charge fees for the provision of non-emergency
- 23 informational and educational services as well as contract therefor;
- 24 (9) Establish a 1-900 telephone number if funding otherwise precludes
- 25 twenty four (24) hour coverage consistent with requirements for certification
- 26 by the American Association of Poison Control Centers.

27

- 28 SECTION 5. The program of the center shall be structured and designed,
- 29 to the extent resources permit, to meet the criteria for certification as a
- 30 state poison control center by the American Association of Poison Control
- 31 Centers.

32

- 33 SECTION 6. (a) Subject to the approval of the Dean of the College of
- 34 Pharmacy of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, registration or
- 35 tuition fees or both in the University of Arkansas System are to be waived for

- 1 those students who provide concurrent services to the center.
- 2 (b) Any funds at the disposal of the College of Pharmacy can be used to
- 3 provide scholarships and fellowships to those providing services to the
- 4 center.

5

- 6 SECTION 7. None of the center personnel or its designees shall incur
- 7 personal liability or be placed in any legal jeopardy for information
- 8 proffered in good faith, professional judgments and responses provided for the
- 9 system, or any good faith professional effort to effectuate the purposes of
- 10 this act.

11

- 12 SECTION 8. Any individual who shall fraudulently represent himself to
- 13 be a person entitled to invoke the services of the center when such is not the
- 14 case and any person who attempts to obtain information later put to illegal
- 15 use in any way shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.

16

- 17 SECTION 9. All of the powers, duties, functions, records, personnel,
- 18 property, unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, and other funds
- 19 of the poison control and drug information portions of the Poison Control-Drug
- 20 Information-Toxicological Laboratory Services Unitary System as provided for
- 21 in Ark. Code Ann. §20-13-501 through §20-13-511 are hereby transferred to the
- 22 College of Pharmacy of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The
- 23 toxicological laboratory services provided for in Ark. Code Ann. §20-13-501
- 24 through §20-13-511 shall remain the responsibility of the Arkansas Department
- 25 of Health.

26

- 27 SECTION 10. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
- 28 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
- 29 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

30

- 31 SECTION 11. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
- 32 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
- 33 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
- 34 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 35 act are declared to be severable.

1 SECTION 12. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 2 3 hereby repealed. 5 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the 6 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly that the public health and safety require that 7 immediate steps be taken to insure immediate passage of this act to protect 8 the citizens of this state from the danger posed by injudicious use of 9 dangerous substances; that this act should become effective at the beginning 10 of the next fiscal year and that unless this emergency clause is adopted this 11 act may not become effective until after that date.
