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25	SECTION 1. Arkansas	Code 24-3-102(5) is her	reby amended to read as

27	"(5) _Public safety	<pre>member_ means a member</pre>	whose covered employment is

The retirement credits for which the officers of the State 6 7 Capitol Police within the Secretary of State's Office would be eligible under 8 this act shall apply retroactive to the implementation of Act 793 of 1977; 9 except that eligibility for the retroactive benefits shall be restricted to 10 employees who retire after July 1, 1993. 11 Title 24, Chapter 3, of the Arkansas Code of 1987, Annotated 12 13 is hereby amended to add a new Section to read as follows: 14 "24-3-107. Benefits for State Capitol Police - Responsibility for 15 additional costs. 16 (a) For purposes of determining retirement benefits under this chapter,
- 17 all credited service, whenever earned, of persons employed as an officer or 18 the director of the State Capitol Police by the Secretary of State's Office on 19 the effective date of this section, and of persons thereafter employed in such 20 positions shall be treated as public safety member service.
- 21 The additional cost to the system of this section shall be the 22 responsibility of the Secretary of State's Office, and the office shall pay to 23 the system any additional percent of covered payroll, as computed by actuarial 24 determination, at the same time as employer contributions are paid by law for 25 other employees.
- 26 (C) It is the specific intent of this section to provide that the 27 contributions determined by actuarial valuation shall be in addition to those 28 required by § 24-3-103(c)."

30 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 31 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 32 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 34 35 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect

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1 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
 2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 3 act are declared to be severable.
         SECTION 6. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act are
 6 hereby repealed.
