	remediation is necessary, it should be provided when students are younger and
	before patterns of failure are established. The General Assembly further
	finds that not all students are financially able to pay for summer school nor
	do all school districts hold summer school. It is therefore the purpose of
	this Act to allow the public school districts of Arkansas to either
	individually or cooperatively provide free summer school and summer school
	transportation to those students in K-3 who did not perform at grade level
	during the regular school year.

33	SECTION 2. (a) Beginning with the summer of 1994, a student in
	kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who did not perform at grade level
	during the regular school year shall attend summer school to be eligible for promotion to the next grade.

         SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
10 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
11 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

14 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
15 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
16 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
17 act are declared to be severable.
