28	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSE	EMBLY OF THE STATE	OF ARKANSAS:

30	SECTION 1. (a) The Arkans	sas Forestry Commis	sion and the Arkansas	
31	Department of Parks and Tourism a	and a member of the	House appointed by the	
32	Speaker of the House and a member	of the Senate app	ointed by the President Pro	
33	Tempore are jointly authorized to	study the feasibi	lity of establishing a	
34	State Historical Museum to be known and operated as the "Arkansas Forestry			
35	Museum".			
36	(b) The feasibility study	shall be completed	prior to July 1, 1994.

The feasibility study shall determine the size of the facility 2 needed and construction cost estimates for said facility. The feasibility study shall determine the annual costs to maintain and operate the museum. The feasibility study shall identify areas of responsibility for 6 the Forestry Commission and Parks and Tourism for funding, planning, 7 construction, staffing, operating and maintaining the museum. R 9 SECTION 2. The feasibility study shall define the mission and scope of 10 the Arkansas Forestry Museum with respect to the acquisition, cataloging, 11 preservation, exhibition and interpretation of records, tools, equipment, 12 machinery, and materials used by foresters and the timber industry in 13 Arkansas. 14 15 SECTION 3. The feasibility study shall determine the methods and 16 criteria for selecting the site for the museum. 17 The feasibility study shall determine the organization, 18 SECTION 4. 19 size, geographic representation, state agency representation, timber industry 20 representation, term limits, and authority for a "Forestry Museum Advisory 21 Committee". 22 SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 23 24 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 25 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 26 SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 2.7 28 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 29 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 30 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 31 act are declared to be severable. 32 33 SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 34 hereby repealed.
