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29	SECTION 1. Arka	nsas Code § 1-4-104(b) is amended to	read as follows:
30	(b) A sufficient quantity of flags shall be obtained to permit the		
31	Secretary of State to make available to each member of the House of		
32	Representatives and the Senate fifteen (15) Arkansas flags and ten (10)

4	calendar year for distribution in the manner authorized in this section.		
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6	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
7	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there currently is an		
8	inadequate supply of flags for members of the General Assembly; that the		
9	members are receiving requests for flags from schools, community groups, an		
10	other constituencies, and are unable to fill those requests; and that this		
11	act is immediately necessary in order to alleviate that situation.		
12	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately		
13	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shal		
14	become effective on:		
15	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
16	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
17	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
18	bill; or		
19	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
20	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
