Arkansas Code § 20-22-901(a) is amended to read as follows: 24 (a)(1) Upon receipt of a report of an uncontrolled fire or a 911 or 25 26 other emergency call reporting a fire, it shall be the duty of volunteer fire 27 departments operating within the State of Arkansas to respond to, attempt to 28 control, and put out all fires occurring within their respective districts 29 involving any real or personal property, whether that property is owned by members or by nonmembers of the fire district. 30 31 (2) However, unless a fire is in violation of a countywide fire 32 ban or as may be otherwise provided in an agreement between a nonmember owner 33 of forested lands, cut-over lands, brush lands, or grasslands and a volunteer fire department the following circumstances exist, the volunteer fire 34 35 department shall have no duty or authority to respond to or attempt to control and put out any fire which occurs on forest lands, cut-over lands, 36

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1	brush lands, or grasslands owned by a nonmember and which does not pose an
2	immediate threat to life or to the real or personal property of a person or
3	entity other than the owner of the land on which the fire occurs.:
4	(A) The fire poses an immediate threat to life of any
5	person;
6	(B) There is a written agreement between a nonmember owner
7	of the real or personal property and the volunteer fire department requiring
8	the fire department to respond;
9	(C) The fire is in violation of a countywide fire ban; or
10	(D) The fire poses an immediate threat to the real or
11	personal property owned by a member of the district.
