23	WHEREAS, B.B. King and "Lucille", his guitar and constant companion
24	since 1949, have become legends in the world of blues; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, the story of B.B. King naming his guitar "Lucille" is
27	legendary in its own right and inextricably linked to the history of a small
28	town in Arkansas; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, in 1949 when B.B. King's career was in its infancy, one of his
31	stops on the road was at a dance hall in Twist, Arkansas, on a cold winter
32	night. In order to keep the dance hall warm, a large barrel of kerosene was
33	placed in the center of the room and was filled about half-way with fuel.
34	The kerosene was then lighted to heat the room, a practice which was not
35	uncommon in those days; and

2	WHEREAS, as B.B. King entertained the crowd, two (2) men started a
3	brawl over a woman named "Lucille" and knocked over the barrel of burning
4	kerosene. Like a river of fire, the burning fuel spilled over the floor.
5	Everyone, including B.B. King, ran for the front door. Once outside, B.B.
6	King realized that he had left his guitar, a Gibson acoustic, at the mercy of
7	the inferno. Back inside the collapsing building he went to rescue his
8	guitar, almost losing his life in the process. The blaze that night claimed
9	two (2) lives; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, B.B. King named his guitar "Lucille", and also every guitar he
12	has owned since that night, to remind him never again to risk his life for a
13	material possession; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, upon speaking about "Lucille", B.B. King says, "I'm very
16	crazy about Lucille. I've had many guitars and I always call them
17	Lucille. She's taken me a long way, even brought me some fame most of
18	all, she's kept me alive, being able to eat Lucille practically saved my
19	life two or three times",
20	
21	NOW THEREFORE,
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23	
24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 13, Chapter 3, Subchapter 1 is amended
25	to add an additional section to read as follows:
26	<u>13-3-109. Permanent marker.</u>
27	The Arkansas History Commission shall erect a permanent marker in the
28	town of Twist, Arkansas, to commemorate the legendary B.B. King and the event
29	that led to his naming his famous guitar "Lucille" while performing there.
