L. No. 81-152 and Pub. L. 1 (a) The State Board of Education Arkansas Department of Emergency 2 <u>Management</u> is authorized to add to the cost of surplus properties secured by 3 the agency for surplus property an amount necessary to defray the expense of 4 this service and to repay into the Revolving Loan Fund loans made to the 5 agency as provided in this section.

6 (b) The state board <u>department</u> is also authorized to establish service 7 charges in such amounts as may be necessary to cover the expenses of the 8 Department of Education in administering special federal service programs for 9 schools and agencies. These charges are to be paid by the school, 10 institution, or agency in the amount designated by the state board 11 department.

12 (c) The <u>state board department</u> is authorized and directed to take such 13 action as is necessary to collect such charges and may, in its discretion, 14 withhold from any state moneys over which the <u>state board department</u> has 15 control funds necessary to pay the amounts owing by such school districts and 16 agencies.
