5	objectives, and develop pilot projects for decreasing disparities under
6	subdivision (5)(A) of this section.
7	(b) The commission shall report two (2) times each year to the House
8	Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor and the Senate Committee on
9	Public Health, Welfare, and Labor.
