29	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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31	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS. There is hereby	
32	appropriated, to the Economic Development Commission, to be payable from the	
33	General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the	
34	following:	
35	(A) for grants for defraying the cost of constructing and operating	
36	Senior Citizen Centers, in a sum not to exceed\$5,000,000.	



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SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 3 GRANTS. 4 The grants authorized in Section 1 of this Act shall not be restricted by 5 requirements that may be applicable to other grant programs currently 6 administered by the Economic Development Commission and such grants shall be 7 equally distributed to Senior Citizen Centers. The Economic Development 8 Commission may adopt rules and regulations to carry out the intent of the 9 General Assembly regarding the grant appropriations authorized in Section 1 10 of this Act. 11 No less than thirty (30) days prior to the distribution of any funds 12 appropriated by this act, the director of the agency shall notify the Speaker 13 of the House of Representatives of the name and address of each recipient and 14 the amount that is being distributed to each recipient. 15 The Area Agencies on Aging shall report to the Economic Development Commission prior to September 1 those Senior Citizen Centers in their 16 17 respective areas that are eligible to receive funding authorized by this act. 18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2011 19 through June 30, 2012. 20 21 SECTION 3. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor

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22 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects 23 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available 24 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and 25 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and 26 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or 27 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State 28 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects 29 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds 30 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General 31 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall 32 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

(B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State
Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the
Revenue Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of
this State and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and

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Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
 disbursement of any funds provided by this act unless specifically provided
 otherwise by law.

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SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 5 6 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 7 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 8 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 9 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 10 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 11 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 12 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 13

14 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 15 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 16 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 17 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of 18 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 19 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 20 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 21 22 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 23 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 24 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011. 25 26 27 APPROVED: 03/09/2011 28
