- (2) Upon request by a volunteer fire department, the quorum court of each county involved may authorize a volunteer fire department to serve a geographical area to extend its geographical service area across the county boundary lines.
  - (c) The quorum court may establish its own countywide fire department, either regular or voluntary.
- (d) This section does not change the authority of intergovernmental cooperation councils to enter into reciprocal agreements or to distribute funds under § 14-284-401 et seq. and § 26-57-614.

5	(B) The county clerk shall not charge any costs or fees
6	for filing the annual report.
7	(C) The volunteer fire department shall deliver a filed
8	copy of the annual report to the county collector within five (5) days of
9	filing.
10	(2) The annual report shall contain the following information as
11	of December 15 of the current calendar year:

32	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
33	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there are scores of volunteer fire
34	departments in this state; that in many areas the only fire protection
35	available is through the local volunteer fire department; and that this act
36	is immediately necessary to ensure the volunteer fire departments can remain

1	viable and continue to serve the state. Therefore, an emergency is declared		
2	to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of		
3	the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
4	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
5	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
6	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
7	<pre>bill; or</pre>		
8	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
9	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
