Amendment No. 2 to House Bill No. 2719.

Amend House Bill No. 2719 as engrossed, H3/25/03:

- Page 1, delete lines 9 through 11 and substitute the following:

 "AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ASSESSMENT
 COORDINATION DEPARTMENT IN LIEU OF ABOLISHING THE ASSESSMENT COORDINATION
 DEPARTMENT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."
- Page 1, delete lines 14 through 16 and substitute the following:

 "TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ASSESSMENT COORDINATION DEPARTMENT."
- Delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute the following: "SECTION 1. (a) There is created the "Taskforce to Study the Assessment Coordination Department".
 - (b) The taskforce shall be composed of the following members:
- - (2) Two (2) members appointed by the Speaker of the House;

- $\underline{\text{(c)}}$ The terms of the members of the taskforce shall expire on December $\underline{\text{31, 2004.}}$
- (d) Vacancies on the taskforce shall be filled in the same manner as provided for the initial appointment.
 - (e) The chairperson shall be selected by the members of the taskforce.
- (f)(1) The taskforce shall meet no less than quarterly at dates to be determined by the chairperson.
- (2) The chairperson shall call the first meeting, which shall be held no later than sixty (60) days after date of effective date of this act.
 - (g) The members of the taskforce shall serve without compensation and



- shall not receive per diem, mileage, or stipends.
- (h) The taskforce shall receive staff support from the Bureau of Legislative Research.
- SECTION 2. <u>(a) The purpose of the Taskforce on Studying the</u>
 <u>Assessment Coordination Department is to provide legislative oversight of the state agency.</u>
 - (b) The taskforce will strive to achieve the following:
- (1) To review the functions of the Assessment Coordination Department;
 - (2) To review the methods used to assess real estate values;
 - (3) To assess the performance of the Assessment Coordination
- Department;
- (5) To make recommendations for improving the efficiency and performance of the Assessment Coordination Department.
- (c)(1) The findings and recommendations of the taskforce shall be submitted to the legislative leaders, state department directors, and other appropriate parties for collaborative reform.
- (2) The taskforce shall report to the Joint Performance Review Committee after each meeting of the task force.
- (3) The taskforce shall make its final report to the Joint Performance Review Committee no later than October 1, 2004.
