Bill: HB1584

Bill Subtitle: TO PERMIT THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO THREE (3) IDENTIFICATION CARDS FOR A PERSON FIVE (5) TO THIRTEEN (13) YEARS OF AGE.

Basic Change:

Sponsor: Representative Vines:

The bill permits the issuance of three (3) identification cards for a person five (5) to thirteen (13) years of age. The cards may be issued at the request of a parent, legal guardian, grandparent, or sibling over eighteen (18) years of age. The request for more than one card must be made on the date the initial identification card is issued. The requestor will pay the \$5.00 fee for each card.

Revenue Impact :

There will be minimal revenue increase to Constitutional Officers Fund and State Central Services. if this bill is passed.

Procedural Changes:

Procedures will be implemented in the Revenue Office to issue the first card as is currently done. The two additional cards will be duplicate transactions and the cards will be labeled duplicates. This procedure will require no additional programming.

Other Comments:

The bill does not contain an emergency clause or an effective date.

Legal Analysis:

HB 1584 provides that children, ages five to thirteen, may be issued up to three identification cards at the request of a parent, legal guardian, grandparent, or sibling over 18 years of age. The request for more than one card must be made at the time the initial identification card is issued. The fee for each card is \$5.00.

Effective date: 90 days after adjournment.
