## **Legislative Impact Statement**

Bill: HB2007

Bill Subtitle: TO ESTABLISH THE ARKANSAS EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION SYSTEM.

Basic Change :

Sponsor: Representative Copenhaver

This bill establishes the Arkansas Emergency Contact Information System (System) to assist law enforcement in notification of next of kin or other designated emergency contact during times of emergency. The Arkansas State Police (ASP) in conjunction with other entities may establish the System. The information is accessible only to law enforcement for emergency notification purposes or pursuant to a court order and shall not be used in a criminal investigation or for any other purpose. The ASP may promulgate rules to implement and administer the System.

Participation in the System is voluntary and limited to a person who holds a valid Arkansas driver's license or identification card. Each participant is responsible for the accuracy of information. All requests by participants to add modify or delete a record in the System is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act.

The bill states that emergency contact records shall otherwise not be modified and shall otherwise be deleted only when the driver's license or identification record no longer exists in Arkansas. Current Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) practice is to keep all records. If the driver is deceased or moves out of state or the license is otherwise surrendered, the license will no longer be active (valid), but the record is not deleted.

Implementation of the System may begin after funding has been obtained.

## Revenue Impact :

None

### Taxpayer Impact :

Taxpayers will not be charged for participation in the System.

## Resources Required:

If ASP would like the System to be updated and the deceased drivers or drivers who move out of state to be removed from the System, then DFA estimates programming of \$8,000 will be required.

#### Time Required:

No additional time is required and implementation will begin once funding has been obtained.

## Procedural Changes:

None

## Other Comments:

This bill does not contain an emergency clause or an effective date.

## Legal Analysis:

If, as the bill states, the information is accessible only to law enforcement, then there would not appear to be any violation of DPPA regarding the information that is on the license or ID card. The bill will be effective 90 days following adjournment.

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
