ASSUMPTIONS - BASED ON:

- √ This bill states that any student receiving Lottery Scholarship funds would not be allowed to utilize the funds for remedial courses.
- $\sqrt{}$ This bill requires that any remedial course be paid:
- 1/3 of the course tuition by the high school from which they graduated
- 1/3 of the course tuition by the student, and
- 1/3 of the course tuition by the institution they are attending.
- This bill would have a significant cost on any district based on the number of students graduating who require remedial courses and will vary based on the institution that the student chooses to attend

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

- √ The number of students who require remediation will vary from year to year, and those obtaining lottery scholarship will vary; therefore assessing the impact to school districts would change each year and cannot be determined.
- $\sqrt{1}$ In 2012, 11,108 college freshmen required remediation; while there were 2,882 college freshmen who receive lottery scholarship requiring remediation.
