15 SECTION 17. EXTRA HELP - WAR MEMORIAL STADIUM - CASH OPERATIONS. There
 16 is hereby authorized, for the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism -
 17 State Parks and Tourism Divisions - War Memorial Stadium - Cash Operations
 18 for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the following maximum number of part-time or
 19 temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds
 20 appropriated herein for such purposes: one hundred fifty (150) temporary or
 21 part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those
 22 provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its
 23 successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

25 SECTION 18. APPROPRIATION - WAR MEMORIAL STADIUM - CASH OPERATIONS.
 26 There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Parks, Heritage, and
 27 Tourism, to be payable from the cash fund deposited in the State Treasury as
 28 determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for personal services
 29 and operating expenses of the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism -

13 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARK
 15 BUDGET ALLOCATION. Prior to July 1 of each fiscal year, the Legislative
 16 Council or the Joint Budget Committee shall review the Parks and Tourism
 17 Department's plan for the upcoming year of amounts to be disbursed for each
 18 park or other entity from the funds appropriated for State Operations of this
 19 Act. The request for review from the agency shall include amounts to be
 20 disbursed for each entity for the upcoming fiscal year compared to the
 21 current fiscal year's anticipated expenditures and the previous fiscal year's
 22 actual expenditures with any additional detail as may be required by the
 23 reviewing body. The Parks and Tourism Department shall also prepare a
 24 semiannual status report for the reviewing body comparing six-month and
 25 fiscal year actual expenditures to intended disbursements reviewed under this
 26 Section.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
 28 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

29

30 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
 32 MAINTENANCE. The funds appropriated in the Conservation Tax Appropriation
 33 Section of this Act for Parks and Tourism Special Maintenance shall be
 34 expended, after receiving prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council
 35 or Joint Budget Committee, for a special maintenance program for the Park
 36 System. The funds provided will be used for repair and upkeep of parks and

1 museum facilities that have been deferred due to lack of funds in the
2 individual budgets of the parks and museums.

3 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
4 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
5 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
6 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
7 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
8 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
9 has determined that the Department of Parks and Tourism may operate more
10 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Parks and
11 Tourism authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both
12 necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by
13 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
14 as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative
15 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section or
16 the Special Maintenance line item. If the requirement of approval by the
17 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a
18 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section and the Special
19 Maintenance line item in the Conservation Tax Appropriation Section is void.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
21 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

23 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CASH
25 PRIZES - STATE PARKS. The Department Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized
26 to award merchandise, gift certificates and cash prizes to contestants in
27 various special events authorized by the Director of State Parks. Such prizes
28 may be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners and shall be payable
29 from the maintenance and operation line item of the Parks Cash Fund. The cash
30 prizes, in aggregate, for all contests, shall not exceed \$10,000 per fiscal
31 year.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
33 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

34
35 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

1 MISSISSIPPI RIVER DOMESTIC - INTERNATIONAL MARKETING PLAN. Of the funds
2 appropriated to the Department of Parks and Tourism - Great River Road for
3 operating expenses in the State Operations Appropriation Section of this Act,
4 up to \$15,000 each year is authorized to be utilized for the implementation
5 of the Mississippi River Domestic - International Marketing Plan.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
7 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

8
9 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PURCHASE
11 OF UNIFORMS. The Department of Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized to
12 purchase from "Maintenance and General Operations" appropriations provided by
13 this Act, uniforms for Parks personnel, Museum Services personnel, Tourist
14 Information Center personnel, and uniforms and blazers to be used by
15 employees of the Department of Parks and Tourism who are staffing sports
16 shows, travel shows and other special promotional programs and special theme
17 costumes or uniforms for state parks. Provided further, that any clothing
18 purchased under the provisions stated in this section shall remain the
19 property of the Department Parks and Tourism and shall be surrendered upon
20 request of the Department or upon termination of employment of the individual
21 to whom the clothing was issued.

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
23 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

24
25 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TOURISM
27 ATTRACTION FEASIBILITY GRANT PROGRAM. Of the funds appropriated to the
28 Department of Parks and Tourism for Tourism/Museum grants in the State
29 Operations Appropriation Section of this Act, the Department is authorized to
30 make grants to cities and counties on a one to one dollar matching basis, up
31 to \$15,000 in state funds per grant, for the purpose of feasibility studies
32 for tourism attractions. The Department is authorized to promulgate rules
33 and regulations for the administration of this tourism attraction feasibility
34 grant program. The Department of Parks and Tourism shall notify House and
35 Senate Legislators representing the district of the award recipient.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~

1 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

2
3 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMPLOYEE
5 CONTRACTS. The Department of Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized to enter
6 into contracts with Department employees for the provision of golf lessons at
7 the Department's golf courses, outside of the employees' normal working
8 hours. Employees shall be Class A members and/or apprentices of the
9 Professional Golfers' Association of America or the Ladies Professional Golf
10 Association. The Director of Arkansas State Parks shall authorize all
11 contracts in accordance with department standards and procedures for
12 concession and operating contracts. Compensation to employees is not
13 retirement eligible.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
15 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

16
17 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SMALL
19 FESTIVAL FUNDING. The General Assembly acknowledges the economic benefits of
20 festivals which attract visitors and stimulate the growth of tourism and
21 businesses statewide.

22 Notwithstanding any other provision of law or rules and regulations
23 promulgated by the Department of Parks and Tourism to the contrary, the
24 Department of Parks and Tourism shall dedicate, commit and budget annually
25 one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the 2% tourism tax
26 credited to the Tourism Development Trust Fund for expense, advertising,
27 marketing or grants for small festivals in Arkansas communities of less than
28 10,500 people. Any funds not granted out in a fiscal year shall be available
29 for other tourism promotion efforts.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~
31 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

32
33 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
35 HELP. The War memorial Stadium Commission may utilize their authorized
36 extra-help positions and contract labor event staff up to a maximum of one

1 thousand eight hundred (1,800) hours during seasonal events. The rates of
 2 pay may not exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification Act, or its
 3 successor, for the appropriate classification. The provisions of this
 4 section shall be in effect from July 1, ~~2019~~ 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

5
 6 SECTION 28. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
 7 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
 8 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
 9 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
 10 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
 12 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 13 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 14 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

15
 16 SECTION 29. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
 17 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
 18 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
 19 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
 20 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
 21 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
 22 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
 23 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

24
 25 SECTION 30. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
 26 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
 27 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
 28 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2020 is essential to the operation of
 29 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
 30 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
 31 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2020 could work irreparable harm
 32 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
 33 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
 34 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
 35 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2020.
