Dear Co-Chairs:

This is to inform you that there are two (2) items for Legislative Council review that require your immediate attention. Because of the time-sensitive nature of this item, the Department of Finance and Administration respectfully requests an expedited review. The following requests have received my approval as Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

The first item is a CARES Act Appropriation Request. This item is a request for additional CARES Act appropriation. The request is required to allow the Arkansas Department of Health to access additional federal funds awarded by the Arkansas CARES Act Steering Committee under Section 36 of Act of 2020, to establish a Comprehensive COVID-19 Response Plan that will outline collaborative efforts to be implemented in northwest and western Arkansas counties.

The second item is also a CARES Act Appropriation Request. This appropriation will be used by Arkansas Department of Health to expend funding awarded to the Arkansas Black Hall of Fame by the Arkansas CARES Act Steering Committee, under Section 36 of Act of 2020. Funds will be used to enhance the Foundation's current grant program and will focus on COVID-19 related issues.

I ask that you please institute emergency action procedures for consideration of these matters and sign them out of Committee per Rule 16 of the Rules of the Arkansas Legislative Council.
