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Subtitle

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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism - State Parks and Tourism Divisions for the 2022-2023 fiscal year, the following maximum number of regular employees.

17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
18 MAINTENANCE. The funds appropriated in the Conservation Tax Appropriation
19 Section of this Act for the Division of Arkansas State Parks Special
20 Maintenance shall be expended, after receiving prior approval by the Arkansas
21 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, for a special maintenance
22 program for the Park System. The funds provided will be used for repair and
23 upkeep of parks and museum facilities that have been deferred due to lack of
24 funds in the individual budgets of the parks and museums.

25 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
26 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
27 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
28 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
29 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
30 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
31 has determined that the Division of Arkansas State Parks may operate more
32 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Parks,
33 Heritage and Tourism authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore,
34 it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain
35 oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint
36 Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by

1 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of
2 this section or the Special Maintenance line item. If the requirement of
3 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled
4 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section
5 and the Special Maintenance line item in the Conservation Tax Appropriation
6 Section is void.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
8 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

9

10 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CASH
12 PRIZES - STATE PARKS. The Division of Arkansas State Parks is hereby
13 authorized to award merchandise, gift certificates and cash prizes to
14 contestants in various special events authorized by the Division Director of
15 Division of Arkansas State Parks. Such prizes may be awarded to the 1st, 2nd
16 and 3rd prize winners and shall be payable from the maintenance and operation
17 line item of the Parks Cash Fund - Operations appropriation section. The cash
18 prizes, in aggregate, for all contests, shall not exceed \$10,000 per fiscal
19 year.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
21 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

22

23 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
25 MISSISSIPPI RIVER DOMESTIC - INTERNATIONAL MARKETING PLAN. Of the funds
26 appropriated to the Division of Arkansas Tourism - Great River Road for
27 operating expenses in the State Operations Appropriation Section of this Act,
28 up to \$15,000 each year is authorized to be utilized for the implementation
29 of the Mississippi River Domestic - International Marketing Plan.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
31 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

32

33 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PURCHASE
35 OF UNIFORMS. The Division of Arkansas State Parks and Tourism is hereby
36 authorized to purchase from "Maintenance and General Operations"

1 appropriations provided by this Act, uniforms for Parks personnel, Museum
2 Services personnel, Tourist Information Center personnel, and uniforms and
3 blazers to be used by employees of the Division of Arkansas State Parks and
4 Tourism who are staffing sports shows, travel shows and other special
5 promotional programs and special theme costumes or uniforms for state parks.
6 Provided further, that any clothing purchased under the provisions stated in
7 this section shall remain the property of the Division of Arkansas State
8 Parks and Tourism and shall be surrendered upon request of the Division or
9 upon termination of employment of the individual to whom the clothing was
10 issued.

11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
12 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

13
14 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TOURISM
16 ATTRACTION FEASIBILITY GRANT PROGRAM. Of the funds appropriated to the
17 Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism for Tourism/Museum grants in the
18 State Operations Appropriation Section of this Act, the Department is
19 authorized to make grants to cities and counties on a one to one dollar
20 matching basis, up to \$15,000 in state funds per grant, for the purpose of
21 feasibility studies for tourism attractions. The Department is authorized to
22 promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of this tourism
23 attraction feasibility grant program. The Department of Parks, Heritage and
24 Tourism shall notify House and Senate Legislators representing the district
25 of the award recipient.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
27 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

28
29 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMPLOYEE
31 CONTRACTS. The Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism is hereby authorized
32 to enter into contracts with Department employees for the provision of golf
33 lessons at the Department's golf courses, outside of the employees' normal
34 working hours. Employees shall be Class A members and/or apprentices of the
35 Professional Golfers' Association of America or the Ladies Professional Golf
36 Association. The Division Director of the Division of Arkansas State Parks

1 shall authorize all contracts in accordance with department standards and
2 procedures for concession and operating contracts. Compensation to employees
3 is not retirement eligible.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
5 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

6
7 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SMALL
9 FESTIVAL FUNDING. The General Assembly acknowledges the economic benefits of
10 festivals which attract visitors and stimulate the growth of tourism and
11 businesses statewide.

12 Notwithstanding any other provision of law or rules and regulations
13 promulgated by the Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism to the contrary,
14 the Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism shall dedicate, commit and
15 budget annually one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the 2%
16 tourism tax credited to the Tourism Development Trust Fund for expense,
17 advertising, marketing or grants for small festivals in Arkansas communities
18 of less than 10,500 people. Any funds not granted out in a fiscal year shall
19 be available for other tourism promotion efforts.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
21 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

22
23 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
25 HELP. The Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism may utilize their
26 authorized extra-help positions and contract labor event staff up to a
27 maximum of one thousand eight hundred (1,800) hours during seasonal events at
28 War Memorial Stadium. The rates of pay may not exceed those provided in the
29 Uniform Classification Act, or its successor, for the appropriate
30 classification.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2021~~
32 2022 through June 30, ~~2022~~ 2023.

33
34 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
35 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
36 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

1 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
2 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
3 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
4 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
5 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
6 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

7
8 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
9 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
10 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
11 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
12 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
13 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
14 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
15 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

16
17 SECTION 31. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after July 1,
18 2022.
