19	routine nursery care and pediatric charges for well newborn children, for
20	mothers of newborns, for mastectomies, for obstetrical and gynecological
21	services, for continuity of care, for exceptions to prescription drug
22	formularies, for orthotic devices, orthotic services, prosthetic devices, and
23	prosthetic services, for necessary care and treatment of loss or impairment
24	of speech or hearing, for any child during the process of adoption, for the
25	necessary care and treatment of alcohol and other drug dependency, and for
26	autism spectrum disorders; and
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29	WHEREAS, the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act
30	(Public Law 111-148) at Sec. 1311(d)(3)(B) (codified at 42 U.S.C. § 13031)
31	specifies that if a state retains health insurance mandates beyond those
32	required for the basic coverage in qualified health plans, the state must
33	assume the cost of those retained mandates; and
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WHEREAS, in order for legislators to protect both consumers and providers of health insurance coverage, a clear understanding of the present and future costs of mandated health insurance benefits is essential, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council of the Eighty-Eighth Arkansas General Assembly refer to the appropriate interim committee a study of the costs to consumers and insurance companies of presently mandated health insurance coverage and the potential costs of retaining state mandated coverage under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
