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7	WHEREAS, the mobile military lifestyle creates tough challenges for
8	military children who attend, on average, six to nine (6-9) different school
9	systems from kindergarten to grade twelve (K-12); and
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11	WHEREAS, through no fault of their own, military families often face
12	difficulties with enrollment, eligibility, placement, and timely graduation
13	of their children; and
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15	WHEREAS, the Council of State Governments' National Center for
16	Interstate Compacts and the Department of Defense, in collaboration with
17	federal, state, and local officials and national stakeholder organizations
18	representing numerous education groups, developed an interstate compact to
19	address the challenges that military children face due to frequent
20	relocations, which has come to be known as the Interstate Compact on
21	Educational Opportunity for Military Children; and
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23	WHEREAS, the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military
24	Children, when enacted in all fifty (50) states, will allow military children
25	enrolled in kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) who transfer between
26	school districts to be treated uniformly; and
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28	WHEREAS, to participate, each state must adopt the Compact through
29	legislation, appoint representation to an ongoing governing commission, and
30	provide nominal funding of one dollar (\$1.00) per active duty military child
31	in the state; and
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33	WHEREAS, currently, forty (40) of the fifty (50) states have adopted
34	the Compact, and every state surrounding Arkansas has adopted the Compact;
35	and
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WHEREAS, each member state that participates in the Compact is provided common guidelines and support for handling issues that impact military children as they transition between schools; and

WHEREAS, a number of states have conducted independent research that concluded the Compact is an effective, multistate agreement to address the unique needs of transitioning military children; and

WHEREAS, in the 2009 Regular Session, the General Assembly enacted a law regarding educational access for military children, Arkansas Code § 6-27-101 et seq.; however, this act only put into law the policy portion of the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and is insufficient to make Arkansas a member of the Compact,

15 NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH
GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Legislative Council assign to the Interim Senate Committee on Education a study of the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children.

BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the committee reviews, hears testimony on, and works with all educational stakeholders to develop a noncontroversial bill draft for introduction in the 2013 Regular Session that incorporates the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and the necessary enabling law so that Arkansas can become a member of the Compact and provide uniform treatment of military children.

BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the committee works with the Joint Budget Committee, fiscal staff, and the Department of Education to ensure that the necessary funding and appropriation is available for Arkansas to join the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, an amount that is estimated to be less than four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500).
