Pursuant to the provisions of Act 1272 of 2009, we are submitting the Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism report for your review.

The Task Force is pleased to report that, through diligent efforts during the 89th General Assembly, legislation to implement Medicaid expansion private option was accomplished during this reporting period. Such progression will allow families with developmentally disabled children to have insurance.

Success was achieved on a second priority. The implementation of the Community First Choice Option allows families to easily and quickly receive the therapeutic services they need by eliminating the Medicaid Waiver’s waiting list without eliminating services.

The legislative priorities to be presented to the 90th General Assembly are as follows:

- Adopt federal laws and regulations relating to the use of restraints and seclusion for all students attending public schools in the state
- Create a statewide campaign using web-based entities to disseminate information regarding developmental disability services to families across the state
- Combine web-based entities and create a campaign to make certain bilingual Pediatricians and educators are knowledgeable about communication links
- Ensure that equitable services are provided to minorities and girls across the state
- Continue standardization of training opportunities
