As you are aware, the Department of Workforce Services has experienced federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program funding cuts.

The expiration of the TANF Supplemental and TANF Emergency Funds, coupled with the exhaustion of the TANF Contingency Fund, has had a far reaching impact upon the TANF Program. Additionally, these cuts have resulted in a rapidly declining TANF Carryforward fund balance.

As we strive to ensure that funding is available to provide the federally-required services to our program participants, we are faced with some rather difficult decisions. One such decision is the need to suspend the use of TANF Program funding for the 2014 – 2015 Fiscal Year for the Community Investment Initiative.

In accordance with Arkansas Act 280 of 2014, I have attached our official certification to this effect.
