**Executive Summary**

Act 528 of 2013 prioritized the investment in evidence-based home visiting programs in Arkansas. For the first time, it is required that at least 90% of state investment in home visiting must be in evidence-based models. The legislation also requires a biannual interdepartmental report on the scope of services provided, cost per family, and program outcomes. Originally the report was to reflect the home visiting efforts of the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH), Arkansas Department of Human Services Division of Childcare and Early Childhood Education (DCCECE), and the State Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board. As of July 1, 2015, however, the Board stopped delivering home visiting services. As a result, this report provides baseline related to Act 528 for the ADH and DCCECE.

A growing body of research suggests that synapse formation in the brain is largely dependent on early childhood experiences. The first year of life is a time of peak development for sensory pathways, language, and higher cognitive function. The first three years of a child's life set the stage for maximum achievement during the years of formal education. Investments in quality, evidence-based home visiting programs have shown a high rate of return when priorities include parental involvement, early intervention and learning, and a focus on at-risk populations. Due to the state's continued home visiting efforts, Arkansas is becoming a nationally recognized leader in positive childhood development efforts.

**Partnerships**

Arkansas's Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting project (MIECHV, funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration) provides services to at-risk mothers and infants in the state through five home visiting models: Following Baby Back Home, Healthy Families America, Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY), Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP), and Parents as Teachers (PAT). One model is administered through the ADH (NFP) and the other four are administered through the Arkansas Home Visiting Network (AHVN), which is convened by Arkansas Children's Hospital.

Another important partnership exists between the AHVN and the DCCECE. These entities deliver home visiting services through the Arkansas Better Chance (ABC) program, which is administered through the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) with state funding. The AHVN and DCCECE work cooperatively; the AHVN provides programmatic oversight and auditing while DCCECE delivers the HIPPY and PAT services. The ABC funding expands home and family services beyond MIECHV to programs statewide.

**Reporting Overview**

Act 528 requires a biannual report that provides the following: 1) Demographic data on the families served, 2) Cost of services provided to enrolled families, 3) Indicators that measure outcomes for each of the nine areas of program goals, and 4) Additional information to assist in the understanding of program effectiveness. This report represents the consolidated effort of ADH and DCCECE and is built on existing data sets for home visiting programs in

Arkansas. The baseline data in the report was collected during the following time frames: ADH data is for the federal fiscal year (October 1, 2014 - September 30, 2015) and DCCECE data is for the (August 18, 2014 – May 28, 2015). Data is being reported for the two different timeframes based on existing reporting requirements for state and federal funds.

Data is collected in different formats by each of the state entities. The ADH uses two versions of the *Efforts-to-Outcomes* (ETO) database: 1) An Arkansas-developed version to capture data for the competitively-funded MIECHV programs and 2) A model-specific system for the formula-funded MIECHV program, NFP. The NFP program also uses the ADH's In-home Services database to collect some benchmark data. The DCCECE use a state-based system, *Child Outcome Planning and Administration* (COPA), to monitor and manage both its home visiting and center-based early childhood programs.

## **Performance Indicators**

The highlighted performance indicators reflected in this *Baseline Outcomes Measurement Report* are: 1) maternal education attainment, 2) breastfeeding, 3) smoking in the home, 4) child medical home, 5) child immunization status, 6) child maltreatment, 7) developmental screenings, and 8) maternal depression.

### *Maternal Education Attainment*

Maternal education attainment is associated with higher earning potential, increased family self-sufficiency, and positively affects child development (i.e., cognitive development and future performance in school).<sup>1</sup> All home visiting programs in Arkansas work with families to determine education and employment goals and connect mothers to resources such as workforce development.

### *Breastfeeding*

Breast milk provides optimal nutrition for infants and properties that guard against illness.<sup>1</sup> Studies suggest that breastfed children are less likely to become obese, develop asthma, have autoimmune diseases, or be diagnosed with childhood cancers in comparison to bottle-fed children.<sup>1</sup> Home visitors encourage mothers prenatally or with newborns to breastfeed and provide them with resources and support.

### *Smoking in the Home*

To reduce smoking in the home, home visitors provide smoking cessation education, support, and referrals to the Arkansas Tobacco Quitline.

### *Child Medical Home*

Home visiting programs encourage families to have a medical home for their child to ensure that they receive continuous medical care by health care providers.

### *Immunization Status*

Home visiting programs provide families with a recommended immunization schedule to protect infants and child to potentially life-threatening diseases.

### *Child Abuse/Neglect*

Incidents involving child maltreatment is greater in infants because they are reliant on their caregiver.<sup>1</sup> Home visiting programs promote positive parenting skills and stress reduction techniques.<sup>1</sup> Home visitors are trained to identify child maltreatment risk in the home and all home visitors are mandated reporters.

### *Developmental Screenings*

Home visiting programs conduct developmental screenings to determine if a child is at-risk for developmental delays. Home visitors refer children who screen poorly on the developmental assessment to early intervention services. Early treatment (during the first three years of life) increases the effectiveness of interventions and reduces long-term costs.<sup>1</sup>

### *Maternal Depression*

Maternal depression negatively affects families. When there is a lack of maternal engagement with a child during their early years, it affects the child's long-term health and learning.<sup>1</sup> Home visitors develop positive relationships with mothers to address depression and refer them to mental health services.

## **Number of Counties Served**

There are approximately 70 out of 75 Arkansas counties that provide home visiting services to at-risk families (See pages 12-28 and the map titled *FY17 ABC and MIECHV-funded Counties Served*).

## Conclusion

Home visiting programs have the potential to reduce poor outcomes associated with poverty. They provide children and families with protective factors to overcome barriers associated with being a part of an at-risk population.<sup>2</sup> Currently, Arkansas home visiting programs serve 5918 families, or approximately 10% of the at-risk population of children zero to five years of age.<sup>3</sup> For review, the performance indicators highlighted in this report are: 1) maternal education attainment, 2) breastfeeding, 3) smoking in the home, 4) child medical home, 5) immunization status, 6) child abuse/neglect, 7) developmental screenings, and 8) maternal depression. The impact of home visiting programs is best illustrated by the maternal education attainment, developmental screenings, and immunization status.

The population of mothers with a high school diploma or equivalent at enrollment in a home visiting program is 59.6%. At the completion of the home visiting program, mother's educational attainment increased to 75.9%. The improvement is important given the known strong association with positive outcomes for children in many areas including school readiness, educational achievement, incidence of low birth weight, and decreased negative health behavior. The more education mother has the more likely her children will have access to material, human and social resources.

The immunization rate for children (ages 0-5) in Arkansas is between 60-70%.<sup>3</sup> The immunization rate for children served by home visitation is 95.7%. Developmental screening rates for children in Arkansas in home visiting programs is 95% compared to 26.3% in the general population of Arkansas children. These higher rates of immunization and developmental screening in the home visiting program are excellent indicators of the child health benefits of these programs.

Arkansas families too often face poverty and its associated stress. Home visiting program are sound public investments to support at-risk families. Although Arkansas's home visiting programs are diverse in form they are alike in function. Nationwide these evidence based programs are proven to promote child health, school readiness, child development, family economic self-sufficiency, maternal health, and positive parenting practices while reducing costly social problems such as child maltreatment, juvenile delinquency, family violence and crime. Further outcome data is being collected which will likely demonstrate these same benefits in Arkansas's families and children. The challenge is assuring all at-risk families access to an appropriate home visiting program. This would require an increase in Arkansas's home visiting programs by three-fold based on current estimates of the numbers of at-risk families.
