INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2011-171

REQUESTING THAT THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS STUDY THE POSSIBLE USE OF INCENTIVES BY STATE AGENCIES AND POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS TO ENCOURAGE THE EFFICIENT DESIGN OF PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, public works projects by the State of Arkansas and political subdivisions of the state, including school districts, represent major investments of public funds; and

WHEREAS, a public works project should be designed in a manner that produces an efficient and functional project at a reasonable price; and

WHEREAS, if a public works project is overdesigned for actual needs, public funds will be wasted by paying too much for the design and construction of the project; and

WHEREAS, one possible means of encouraging the efficient design of public works projects is for state agencies and political subdivisions to provide incentives for cost-efficient designs to firms designing public works projects,

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH (88th) GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

THAT the Senate Interim Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs study the possible use of incentives by state agencies and political subdivisions to firms designing public works projects to encourage the designing of public works projects in an efficient manner that will ensure fair and accurate pricing during the bid process and the construction of the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the interim committee permit the testimony of persons with knowledge of the costs associated with public works projects as a part of the interim study.
