In April, Office Manager Ridgley **represented the agency** at a meeting of the Spirit of 110 Council. Director Maher made a presentation at the same meeting, held in the CZDC conference room. Ridgley also met with representatives from the Arkansas Genealogical Society.

Maher represented the agency at meetings of the Downtown Little Rock Partnership's Main Street Task Force and Existing Structures Subcommittee, at a meeting of the Downtown Neighborhood Association's Board of Directors, at an event hosted by the Quapaw Quarter Association, and at a public hearing hosted by Metroplan. Maher also met with representatives from Metroplan, Arkansas Building Authority, and Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, as well as with the Secretary of State.

Maher and Historic Preservation Coordinator Jordan represented the agency at the Arkansas Preservation Conference, and at an event hosted by the Downtown Little Rock Community Development Corporation.

The Mansion Area Advisory Committee met in April. Committee members contributed approximately **10 hours of volunteer service** to the agency. The Commission met and contributed **4.5 hours of volunteer time**.
