Please amend SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION – GRANTS as follows:

There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Human Services – Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance, to be payable from the paying account as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for grant payments of the Department of Human Services – Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:

I respectfully request the following amendments to SB102, the 2019-2020 Appropriation Bill for the Arkansas Department of Human Services – Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services.

Please amend the following section as follows:

"SECTION 11. APPROPRIATION – ARKANSAS SENIOR OLYMPICS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Human Services – Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services, to be payable from the Aging and Adult Services Fund Account Behavioral Health Services Fund Account, for matching funds for the Arkansas Senior Olympics of the Department of Human Services – Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:"

This will allow the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services to continue to provide general revenue funding to the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in a lump sum once the Arkansas Sports Organization certifies its two-to-one state/local matching funds.

Please insert the following SECTION and renumber accordingly.

SECTION X. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD – COMMUNITY BASED CRISIS INTERVENTION. Any unexpended balance of funds allocated for Community Based Crisis Intervention in the Department of Human Services – Division of Aging, Adult and Behavioral Health Services from the Behavioral Health Services Fund Account which remain at the close of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next state fiscal year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in law. Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

(1) Prior to June 30, 2020 the Agency shall by written statement set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

(2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request

set forth in (1) above;

- (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget Committee; and
- (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

This language will allow the agency to carry forward any unexpended funds allocated for the Community Based Crisis Intervention Centers.

Please insert the following SECTION and renumber accordingly.

SECTION X. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD – COMMUNITY BASED CRISIS INTERVENTION. Immediately upon the effective date of this Act, any unexpended balance of funds allocated for Community Based Crisis Intervention in the Department of Human Services – Division of Aging, Adult and Behavioral Health Services from the Behavioral Health Services Fund Account which remain at the close of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next state fiscal year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in law. Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

- (1) Prior to June 30, 2019 the Agency shall by written statement set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;
- (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request set forth in (1) above:
- (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee containing

all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget Committee; and

(4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

Please amend the emergency clause as follows:

SECTION X. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the exception that Section X in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019, with the exception that Section X in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019; with the exception that Section X of this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

This language will allow the agency to carry forward any unexpended funds allocated for the Community Based Crisis Intervention Centers with effective date upon approval of the Act for Fiscal Year 2019.
