- transition to a state-funded deputy prosecuting attorney system, to provide 1 an appropriate and adequate level of legal representation through deputy 2 prosecuting attorneys in all areas of the state. It is recognized by the 3 General Assembly that in many areas of the state, resources have not been 4 available to support deputy prosecuting attorney salaries at the necessary 5 level. With the transition of local funding of deputy prosecuting attorney 6 salaries to state funding, it is not the intent of the General Assembly to 7 adversely affect those districts whose system has been working well or to 8 implement a system which is too inflexible to respond to the needs of each 9 judicial district. SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.
