Attached please find a summary report of FY21 Arkansas Arts Council grants in compliance with A.C.A. § 19-4-2201.

These grants are funded through an annual State Partnership federal grant from the National Endowment for the Arts; Arkansas Conservation Tax and General Revenue appropriations; and a generous grant of \$154,000 from the Windgate Foundation, augmenting support for arts curriculum development and summer/after-school artist-in-residency programs. Other grants in this summary provide annual general operating support to established local arts organizations; major project support for local partnerships; and programs providing administrative and marketing skills to help visual and performing artists participate fully in Arkansas's growing creative economy.

Applications this year were exhaustively panel- and staff-reviewed and represent the recommendations of the Governor-appointed Arts Advisory Council at its June 25, 2020 meeting.
