In 2021-22 a 2.5% increase to salary schedules and a bonus of 1.2% of each employee's contract was provided. In 2022-23 a 2.0% increase was provided to all salary schedules. All of these were provided out of the District operating budget. We have revised the ARP plan to provide a \$2,300 bonus to licensed and \$1,150 bonus to classified employees pending board approval in September. We have \$6.5M remaining of the \$8.2M that was provided, the 4th from the bottom when looking at the allocation per student. Bentonville Schools received \$455.49 per student while those districts at the top received \$13,189.59 per child. We are requesting additional ARP funds to fully meet the recommendation of the ALC.

Many Trumann School District dollars are spent maintaining, repairing, replacing parts, etc. annually to keep the HVAC system operational. Every year we leave open 2- 3 classrooms so that teachers can rotate in them as their classroom air or heat quits working for weeks at a time (awaiting repairs).  When the third wave of COVID related dollars (ARP funds) were allocated and rules allowed for those monies to fund facility improvements related to COVID, the decision was made to replace the failing HVAC system. This would allow our THS students and staff to have a properly functioning, clean/fresh air (COVID friendly/safe), HVAC system for THS students.  Written plans for approval of this project (and two others) with the state were submitted. We did receive approval (July 2021) for all three projects and proceeded to move forward with them.  The HVAC project was written to use an Energy Savings Program Provider as the designer and construction company. We advertised (soliciting RFQs from Qualified Providers to act as Contractor/Construction Manager for an Energy Savings Contract), followed timelines, and selected the best quality company based on the RFQ—Entegrity, with whom we are under contract with currently for this project.  Since that time, it has been a long year of inflation. Entegrity has kept us updated the past yearas many battles have been navigated. The state's price per square foot for our HVAC project replacement totaled approximately \$2 million. The first preliminary quote came in at \$6 million. The team engaged with architects, engineers, etc. and just in the last two months (after almost a year of work) was able to give an update on a workable solution at around \$4.8

Our funding was not enough to meet the requirements of the ALC. During the 21-22 school year the district used ESSER III ARP funds for staffing interventionist in the elementary, middle and high school. We hired interventionist for the 22-23 school year to help shrink the gap of learning loss within the district. Another cost was for technology Chromebooks for students in the district. 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9/7/2022 9:52	506000	Lead Hill School District	Tami Richey	\$805,265.01	No		The certified staff at Lead Hill School District (LHSD) has received Recruitment and Retention bonuses from the state the past two years that the District matched with district funds for the classified staff. The minimum amount received by all staff members each year was \$1,953, with more going to first and second year certified staff. Therefore, ARP ESSER funds were not used to provide additional pay.  Because of prior expenditures, providing summer school to address learning loss, paying for additional staff to address learning loss, and the allocation for a current renovation project to provide more room to address learning loss, the Lead Hill School District does not have sufficient ARP ESSER funds remaining to meet the recommendation of the ALC.
