# Arkansas Department of Health Supplemental Funding to Support IIS and Ukrainian Populations \$757,298 award from July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2025 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

#### **Background**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases (NCIRD) is awarding supplemental funding to support Immunization Information Systems (IIS) and to support the administration of vaccine to recently displaced Ukrainians resettled in the U.S. NCIRD is awarding supplemental funds totaling \$75 million to all "IP19-1901 Immunization and Vaccines for Children" recipients to support immunization information systems. This funding comes from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (PL 117-2). Additionally, NCIRD is awarding a total of \$3,155,664 from annual CDC appropriations in both operations and 317 FA vaccine funding to jurisdictions receiving resettled Ukrainian citizens. Funding will support vaccination of the Ukrainian population.

#### **Purpose**

The Arkansas project was awarded a total of \$778,078 in funding to support Immunization Information Systems (IIS) and to support the administration of vaccine to recently displaced Ukrainians resettled in the U.S. Funding in the amount of \$757,298 will support ongoing operations, maintenance, and enhancement of Immunization Information Systems (IIS) due to the critical role IIS play in monitoring vaccination coverage; ensuring equitable distribution and administration of vaccine; and responding to public health emergencies. The project will complete activities to modernize systems, improve data quality, use data to drive action, increase staffing, and optimize processes. This funding will be used to accelerate previously approved budget year 4 activities; and develop new activities to meet CDC requirements in Immunization Program Operations Manual (IPOM).

#### Strengthening HAI/AR Program Capacity Guidance

#### Purpose

The purpose of these funds is broadly intended to provide critical resources to state, local, and territorial health departments in support of a broad range of healthcare infection prevention and control (IPC) activities and epidemiologic surveillance related activities to detect, monitor, mitigate, and prevent the spread of infections in healthcare settings such as healthcare associated infections (HAIs) and antimicrobial resistance (AR). This funding includes significant resources related to healthcare worker education, outbreak response activities, expanded lab capacity, and promotion of antibiotic stewardship. Moreover, the prevention of AR pathogens and improving the appropriate use of antibiotics helps to protect patients from complications and potential comorbidities.

These funds will pay for positions for the Outbreak Prevention Branch. The positions include a Senior Epidemiologist, microbiologists, epidemiologists, infection prevention nurses. Approximately \$4.1 million

It will cover supplies to office supplies, printer supplies, computers/laptops, SAS licenses, lab supplies, equipment supplies, travel to Outbreak conferences, and in-state travel. It will also cover technical support and training, LIMS Technical Assistance, Stewardship collaboration conference and Educational Training. Approximately \$600K

Nursing Home & Long-Term Care Facility Strike Team and Infrastructure Project Guidance

#### Purpose

The purpose of this funding is to assist skilled nursing facilities and other long-term care facilities during their response to SARS-CoV-2 infections, and to build and maintain statewide capacity for the infection prevention infrastructure necessary to support resident, visitor, and facility healthcare personnel safety. Primary activities are aimed at response to COVID-19, but other infectious disease and conditions may be reasonably addressed to the extent they are in support of or related to work to control the spread of SARS-CoV-2. Long-term care facilities are prioritized for specific COVID-19 funds due to the nature of transmission of COVID-19 and the high impact this can have in these settings. Funds are available to be spent up to one year after the end of the federal public health emergency is declared over. As such, funds have been aimed at purchasing point of care testing supplies, respirator fit testing supplies, and through various subgrants to improve infection control competencies through train the trainer education opportunities, on-site assessments, regional educational offerings, infection prevention collaborative to support system wide best practices, and through development of a long-term care respiratory protection program toolkit.

This one will cover \$6.6 million approx. to go towards sub-grants to cover flu supply kits, PCR respiratory panel testing supplies, train-the trainer kits and trainings, and educational trainings.

#### ARKANSAS STATE PLAN: ARP ESSER

Funds were distributed to states in three separate packages, at different times, with different purposes.

- 1. CARES (ESSER 1)-Relief
- 2. Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (ESSER II)-Recovery
- American Recovery Plan (ARP ESSER)-Sustain and Maximize Opportunities for In-Person Learning/ Emerging Stronger after the Pandemic

ARP ESSER funding required states to create a plan for how funds will be used and contained specific provisions for states to use funding to address learning loss. The requirements apply to the State Education Agency and Local Education Agencies. The state plan can be accessed here:

DESE is continuing to seek feedback from stakeholders through a partnership with Forward Arkansas. Forward is currently conducting a follow-up State of Education study that includes a review of progress since the 2015 State of Education report, the impact of COVID 19 on Arkansas education, and recommendations for future priorities. Forward is currently conducting stakeholder feedback sessions, interviews, and focus groups, statewide.

The American Rescue Plan prescribes in broad categories how the state must use its 10% allocation. The broad categories are linked <a href="here">here</a>:

- 5% Carry out activities to address the academic impact of lost instructional time
- 1% Implementation of evidenced-based summer programs
- 1% Implementation of evidence-based comprehensive after school programs

#### Background

Supported in part by the American Rescue Plan Act, the OE22-2203: Strengthening U.S. Public Health Infrastructure, Workforce, and Data Systems grant is a new investment that supports critical public health infrastructure. Funding from this grant aims to ensure that everywhere has the people, services, and systems needed to promote and protect health. Grant strategies included recruiting, retaining, and supporting the public health workforce; improving organizational systems and processes for public health; and modernization and increasing efficiency in data infrastructures. The CDC intends to make resources available for a first five-year period, and then a continued cooperative agreement after that. The grant is separated into three strategy areas: A1 Workforce, A2 Foundational Capabilities and A3 Data Modernization. Currently, ADH has received funding for A1 at \$29,122,015 for the total five years; and A2 at \$1,353.364 for the first year and intends to continue at least that amount for years 2-5. A3 has been approved but not yet funded. The effective period of the initial award is December 1, 2022-November 30, 2027.

#### **Purpose**

The COVID-19 pandemic and its corresponding response highlighted some critical needs in the public health workforce in Arkansas. The Arkansas Department of Health (ADH), as the centralized authority for public health in the state, must prioritize recruiting, properly training, supporting, and retaining a robust public health workforce. Additionally, improvements in several foundational infrastructure areas are expected to create a more efficient and effective public health system for Arkansas. Many of these improvements address modernizing ADH processes, positioning the department to be a better service provider and partner, and to be more responsive to changing circumstances brought on by a public health emergency.

#### Goals

ADH has identified programs that currently have staff supported by grants that are set to expire but that have critical work to continue, like the Office for Health Disparities Elimination, the Epidemiology branch, and the Office of Performance Management, Quality Improvement and Evaluation. To continue to support and retain staff, there will be increased opportunities for training and professional development, along with support for earning applicable certificates. Additionally, goals include efforts to increase wellness among staff. The grant requires the hiring of a Workforce Director that will manage this grant and opportunities that support the entire workforce, and an Evaluator to evaluate this grant. Further, investments in critical supply/equipment needs will be made—like laptops and accessories for remote work accessibility, and improved organization systems and processes like software for document routing for review and grant management. These projects aim to create stronger public health capabilities and increased availability/use of public health staff.

#### Sustainability

The CDC intends this to be a continued cooperative agreement beyond the first 5-year period. While some of these investments are a one-time event, ADH will continue to look for opportunities to sustain the work that is needed if this grant is unavailable in the future.

The table above lists the previous ARP ESSER Plan budget and the revised budget. The school originally planned to spend the entire grant on a literacy specialist position for three years and tutors. The literacy specialist position has proved difficult to hire. The position was filled but has been vacated again. The position vacancy has caused a need to revise the budget to spend the funds efficiently. The ARP ESSER grant requires 20% of the award be spent on Learning Loss categories. This budget revision results in 91% of the award being spent on Learning Loss categories.

Below is a summary of the budget changes made:

**Facility Maintenance:** The school has very old HVAC systems always in need of repairs. If the HVAC system is down, there is no fresh air circulation in the buildings, leading to an unhealthy learning environment conducive to germ spreading.

**In School Acceleration:** A literacy specialist will be hired to work directly with students struggling with literacy learning. If a full-time position cannot be filled, the school may use contracts or extra help to bring in a specialist. This category also covers any high-quality learning materials the education staff needs to achieve learning goals.

**Tutors:** The school will pay their staff (via stipends) or non-ASB staff to provide tutoring to any student needing extra instruction.

**After School Program**: After school activities that provide more educational opportunities will be funded in this category. Because ASB has serves as a residential school for many students, there are educational activities that can occur after hours with afternoon and night staff.

**Summer School:** The school has a three-week summer session to provide learning and social activities for visually impaired children. These funds can be pay for the summer staff, supplies, curriculum, and activities.

**Technology**: These funds will ensure educators have the appropriate equipment to lead their classrooms. The technology purchases will also provide educators the ability to teach virtually or from a distance should a need arise in the future.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) was passed by Congress and signed into law to provide economic relief due to COVID-19. Part of ARPA was apportioned to the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Section 5310 program. For the Department, this amounts to \$590,031 for Arkansas' Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program at 80% federal dollars and 20% local match. Agencies will utilize ARPA funding to enhance transportation services for seniors and individuals with disabilities, and to fill gaps in service and increase ridership due to the effects of COVID-19. The scope of work includes assistance to public and private non-profit organizations across the state to purchase specialized vehicles while they recover from COVID-19. This will allow the State to meet, preserve, and continue the services to seniors and individuals with disabilities.

Expenditures incurred by the agencies are allowable, allocable, reasonable, and necessary to operate, maintain, and manage a public transportation system that are eligible for this funding. Vehicles purchased usually include such costs as wheelchair lifts, wheelchair restraints, lifts or ramps, and other methods to minimize confusion for riders and personnel while meeting Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations and Title VI concerns. The funds would be distributed as follows:

Act 199 of 2022, Section 37 and Act 997 of 2021, Section 38 (attached), requires a peer review of all ARPA funding by the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration (DFA). Due to the newness of this law, the Public Transportation Programs Section has been working with the Department's Chief Fiscal Officer and DFA to ensure the correct process is being followed and that it has a timely review. The Transportation Planning and Policy Division is currently requesting the Director's signature on the DFA's ARPA authorization request form to start the peer review process, and ultimately to utilize the \$1,154,271 of ARPA funds that have been set aside by FTA for Rural Areas and the Rural Transit Assistance Program (RTAP).
