Restricted Reserve Fund Transfer Request

Dear Secretary Walther:

Pursuant to the provisions of A.C.A. §19-5-1263(d)(1), this letter is a request for a transfer of \$5.7 million from the Restricted Reserve Fund (MRR0000) to the Arkansas Economic Development Commission Fund Account to provide for the Arkansas Rural Connect (ARC) program.

This request is necessary to support the creation and implementation of the Arkansas Rural Connect program, which will extend broadband internet access across the state by the year 2022. High-speed internet is necessary to remain competitive in the global marketplace and this program will ensure access to all cities and towns with populations of at least 500.

While the Arkansas Economic Development Commission maintains sufficient appropriation necessary to support this request, it lacks the general revenue or other funds necessary to launch the Arkansas Rural Connect program. Attached is the planned expenditures by line item budget of the requested funding for the Arkansas Acceleration Fund Program (Funds Center U11A, Fund HoA0104); the available blocked appropriation balance payable for grants in this account is \$5,700,000. The total authorized amount is \$6.5 million, with \$800,000 currently budgeted for acceleration grant matching funds. The remaining balance of the \$25 million plan will be requested as a supplemental during the fiscal session.

Your support will allow the state to assist our local communities with the critical funding necessary to reach our goal of statewide connectivity.

Pending your approval of this request, I ask that you schedule this item for consideration at the next meeting of the Arkansas Legislative Council for appropriate action as required by law.

There have not been any expenditures year to date from this fund; however, \$800,000 is reserved for a state grant matching program that will be spent later this fiscal year.
