Secretary Walther.

This letter is to request the transfer of \$200,000 from the Rainy Day Fund to support Arkansas' preparations for redistricting election precinct boundaries in 2021.

As you are aware, the Division of Geographic Information Systems of the Department of Transformation and Shared Services (GIS) has a statutory obligation to collect and public information on precinct boundaries in anticipation of a decennial census.

Purchasing the software will unify all of Arkansas into one redistricting strategy and simultaneously ensure all levels of election geography are available to Legislative Research, the Arkansas Board of Apportionment, the Executive Branch, and local officials at the County Clerk offices who are required to reassign all voters to their new districts. This would save valuable time and avoid balloting errors for the next election cycle.

In order to meet this obligation, GIS has requested additional funding to purchase software which will allow for a single, statewide redistricting strategy. This strategy, once implemented, will save time and money and avoid potential errors.

Subject: Request for Rainy Day Funds

BACKGROUND

The Transformation and Shared Services Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Office is requesting \$200,000 in Rainy Day Funding to purchase a coordinated statewide redistricting system. The GIS Office has provided technical support and played an advisory role in the redistricting process for the last two decades and must prepare to get this system operational for 2021 when Arkansas will once again undertake redistricting.

The GIS Office has a statutory role to collect and publish the election precinct boundaries from all Arkansas counties. GIS has an extremely tight budget and no additional funds available to upgrade software ahead of the redistricting process.

Purchasing the software will unify all of Arkansas into one redistricting strategy and simultaneously ensure all levels of election geography are available to Legislative Research, the Arkansas Board of Apportionment, the Executive Branch, and local officials at the County Clerk offices who are required to reassign all voters to their new districts. This would save valuable time and avoid balloting errors for the next election cycle. We've attached a memo from GIS that includes more detailed information about the proposal.

RECOMMENDATION

Release \$200,000 in Rainy Day Funds to the Arkansas GIS Office. GIS has available appropriation through the GIS Trust Fund account.
