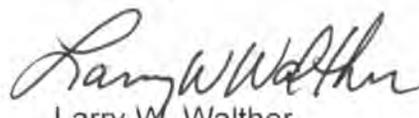

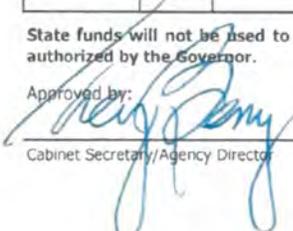

The US Department of Education has awarded federal funds through the American Rescue Plan Act's Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund. These funds support students and institutions towards recovery from the worldwide pandemic.

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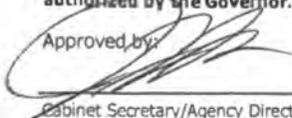

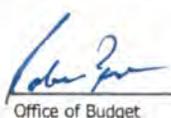

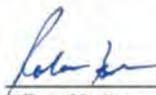

Arkansas Tech University has received funding from U.S. Department of Education as part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. \$11,702,936 is the “student” portion, and \$10,900,582 is the “institutional” portion.

In June 2021, Arkansas Tech University requested and received a supplemental appropriation from the Peer committee and the Legislative Council. Pursuant to that request, \$1,100,000 is to be used solely for emergency financial aid grants to students for Summer 2021. For consideration by the July 2021 meeting of the Peer Committee and the Legislative Council, Arkansas Tech University is requesting a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$12,650,000 that will be spent as follows:

A. Student Funds -Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

\$5,000,000 of emergency financial aid grants to students would be funded from the “student portion” of the American Rescue Plan Funds.

The guidance accompanying the American Rescue Plan Act funds states that when making emergency financial aid grants to students, institutions receiving these funds are to prioritize students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants or are undergraduates with extraordinary financial circumstances when awarding emergency financial aid grants to students. Beyond Pell eligibility, other types of exceptional need could include students who may be eligible for other federal or state need-based aid or have faced significant unexpected expenses either for themselves or that would affect their financial circumstances, such as loss of employment, reduced income, or food or housing insecurity.

Consistent with the requirement that institutions prioritize students with exceptional need the maximum amount of emergency assistance that is provided by this grant at this time is as follows:

- \$2,500 for undergraduate students who have exceptional need such as full Pell eligible or extraordinary financial circumstances.
- \$1,500 for undergraduate students who are eligible for some Pell Grant funds, but not the full award.
- \$1,000 for undergraduate or graduate students who have need but are not eligible for Pell Grants.

There is an application process for students to request funding from this grant. The Arkansas Tech University application process asks students to identify how the grant funds will be used. These grant funds may be used for any component of the student’s cost of attendance¹, and for costs that have arisen due to coronavirus such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.

Consistent with the requirement that institutions prioritize students with exceptional need, the **application will open to undergraduate students with exceptional need on August 11, 2021**. To ensure priority consideration for funding, Pell eligible or extraordinary need undergraduate students should complete the application by the priority deadline date of **September 15, 2021**.

Undergraduate students who are not Pell eligible and graduate students may apply beginning September 16, 2021. The deadline for all students to submit applications is 5:00 p.m., November 15, 2021. Funds will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis. Once the priority deadline has passed, all other students who are not eligible for Pell Grants may apply. Applications will be processed in the order they are received and grants may continue to be awarded if funds remain.

B. Institutional Funds – Discharge of Unpaid Balances Owed by Students to Institution

\$2,100,000 in HEERF institutional funds will be used to discharge student's unpaid balances by discharging the complete balance of the debt as lost revenue and then reimbursing the institution via the HEERF institutional grant funds. On May 11, 2021, the U.S. Department of Education published the *Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III Frequently Asked Questions* that provide guidance on the use of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds. Question number 26 specifically addresses discharge of student unpaid balances to the institution as follows:

26. Question: Can my institution use ARP or other HEERF institutional grant funds to discharge student debt or unpaid balances to their institutions?

Answer: Yes. Institutions may discharge student debt or unpaid balances by discharging the complete balance of the debt as lost revenue and reimbursing themselves through their HEERF institutional grants or by providing additional emergency financial grants to students (with their permission). The Department strongly encourages institutions to discharge such debt. The following examples are listed to provide guidance to institutions on handling these situations:

Example 1: Transcript withholding: A student who was enrolled in an institution at any point on or after March 13, 2020 with a now-completed degree owes an unpaid debt to the institution and could not obtain an official transcript until the debt is paid off.

Example 2: Enrollment hold: A student who is enrolled at the institution at any point on or after March 13, 2020 and in progress toward a degree is blocked from enrolling in the next term because of an unpaid balance.

Example 3: Transfer student: A student who is enrolled at the institution at any point on or after March 13, 2020 and has completed progress toward a degree is blocked from obtaining an official transcript to transfer their credits because of an unpaid balance.

The following are two possible solutions to address the three examples above:

Solution #1: Get affirmative written consent to provide an emergency financial aid grant to the student's account:

- *What the institution can do:* Institutions can provide an emergency financial aid grant to the student in the amount of the outstanding balance through their HEERF grants, including associated fees and penalties. The Department encourages institutions to waive associated fees and/or penalties that may have resulted from delays, actions, or needs related to the pandemic.³

- *What the institution cannot do:* Institutions cannot discharge a student’s outstanding account balance, without prior written consent from the student. As always, students have discretion about how they receive their grants, and institutions must receive affirmative written consent from students before using emergency financial aid grants to satisfy a student’s outstanding account balance. In obtaining such affirmative written consent, the Department encourages institutions to include a disclaimer whereby students are expressly notified that they have the ability to decline the emergency financial aid grant to pay off debts and instead may use the funds for any component of the student’s cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or child care.

Solution #2: Discharge the student’s outstanding balance and count it as lost revenue:

- *What the institution can do:* Institutions can discharge the complete balance of the debt as lost revenue and reimburse themselves through their HEERF grants, including associated fees and penalties.⁴
- *What the institution cannot do:* The institution cannot condition, nor imply that it will condition, discharging these funds on the condition the student takes any specified actions (i.e., no conditioning a discharge of debt on continued reenrollment). Additionally, institutions may only charge the debt as lost revenue and reimburse themselves through one of the HEERF programs (i.e., no double-dipping).

C. Institutional Funds - HVAC

\$5,550,000 in HEERF institutional funds will be used to replacement/renovate HVAC systems for three major classroom buildings on campus - Witherspoon Hall, Crabaugh Hall, and Dean Hall. On May 11, 2021, the U.S. Department of Education published the *Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III Frequently Asked Questions* that provide guidance on the use of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds. Question number 24 from that guidance specifically addresses use of institutional funds for HVAC expenditures, as follows:

24. Question: What are some examples of permissible “minor remodeling” that HEERF grant funds may support under the definition in [34 CFR § 77.1](#)?

Answer: Minor remodeling means minor alterations in a previously completed building, for purposes associated with the coronavirus. The term also includes the extension of utility lines, such as water and electricity, from points beyond the confines of the space in which the minor remodeling is undertaken but within the confines of the previously completed building. The term does not include permanent building construction, structural alterations to buildings, building maintenance, or repairs.

Some examples of permissible minor remodeling may include, but are not limited to:

- The installation or renovation of an HVAC system, to help with air filtration to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- The purchase or lease of temporary trailer classroom units to increase social distancing.
- The purchase or costs of the installation of “room dividers” within a previously completed building to increase social distancing.

American Rescue Plan Act - Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students (Student Portion)

The University intends to distribute emergency financial aid grants to students during the Summer and Fall semesters of FY2022 from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. In accordance with the guidance of the US Department of Education, the University will prioritize the emergency financial aid grants for students with exceptional need. As such, those students completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with Pell Grant eligibility will receive the highest available emergency financial aid grant. Grant values will then be tiered based on each student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined through the FAFSA. The University also intends to make available a small portion of emergency financial aid grant funds for those students who cannot, or do not, complete a FAFSA or for those whose financial circumstances have been significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

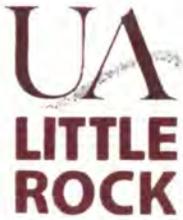

Overview

On May 20, 2021, the University of Arkansas at Little Rock received \$18,754,584 in funding from the U.S. Department of Education for the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The portions designated as student and institutional are \$9,766,800 and \$8,987,784, respectively.

Student Portion

The University of Arkansas at Little Rock proposes to disburse funds from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to students during fall 2021, spring 2022, summer 2022, and fall 2022. UA Little Rock is required to disburse \$9,766,800 to students from the student portion of the grant and proposes to allocate an additional \$898,778 from the institutional portion, resulting in a total of \$10,665,578 for student emergency financial aid grants. The student funding methodology consists of two components:

- 1) A formula-based approach for eligible undergraduate students known as "ARP Direct Aid for Undergraduates," and
- 2) An application-based approach for eligible students (both undergraduate and graduate) to submit emergency financial aid grants to an evaluation team for individual consideration. This component of the disbursement plan will be known as the "ARP Aid Application."

Based on prior student emergency aid applications, UA Little Rock expects student aid needs related to the coronavirus to continue into fall 2022. Therefore, UA Little Rock will seek an extension of ARP funds to allow disbursement of student funds during fall 2022. UA Little Rock plans to disburse an estimated \$7,021,507 during the fiscal year 2021-2022, and an estimated \$3,644,071 during the first half of the fiscal year 2022-2023.

ARP Direct Aid for Undergraduates

UA Little Rock will give preference to students who demonstrate financial need. As a result, UA Little Rock will continue to focus direct aid disbursements to undergraduate students who have submitted the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and demonstrate financial need. The formula for calculating the amount of direct aid for each undergraduate student will be *the amount of aid per credit hour (based on unmet financial need category) multiplied by the number of credit hours the student enrolled in for the term*. The amount of aid per credit hour will vary by term (based on available funds), and generally has a range of \$35 to \$60 per credit hour.

A full-time (12 credit hours) undergraduate student with the least amount of unmet financial need is expected to receive approximately \$420. A full-time (12 credit hours) undergraduate student with the most amount of unmet financial need is expected to receive approximately \$720 through the formula approach. Additional funding will be available to students through the ARP Aid Application.

ARP Aid Application

An application has been developed to allow students from all academic levels (undergraduate, graduate, and law) to apply for emergency financial aid grants. Undergraduate students with exceptional financial needs who receive a direct aid disbursement may receive additional funds through the ARP Aid Application. Awards made under the ARP Aid Application are expected to vary from \$200 to \$750, based on a student's particular unmet financial needs.

Institutional Portion

Per the guidance accompanying the ARP funds, the institutional portion may be used to defray expenses associated with the coronavirus (including lost revenue, reimbursement for expenses already incurred, technology costs associated with a transition to distance education, faculty and staff trainings, and payroll); and make additional emergency financial aid grants to students. Additionally, the ARP has added two new required uses of HEERF III institutional portion grant funds for public and private nonprofit institutions. A portion of institutional funds must be used to: (a) implement evidence-based practices to monitor and suppress coronavirus in accordance with public health guidelines; and (b) conduct direct outreach to financial aid applicants about the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment due to the recent unemployment of a family member or independent student, or other circumstances.

The University of Arkansas at Little Rock proposes to disburse funds from the American Rescue Plan to (1) provide direct grants to students for emergency relief under the provisions provided by the U.S. Department of Education; (2) reimburse for lost revenues in auxiliary services and tuition and fees; and (3) reimburse for expenses incurred with the monitoring and suppressing of the coronavirus, technology, and financial aid outreach.

The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences respectfully requests review of the supplemental appropriation request for expenditures related to both the student and institutional portion of the funding from the American Rescue Plan Act authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021. UAMS has provided detail plans for your review and consideration that (1) provide direct grants to students for emergency relief under the provisions provided by the US Department of Education, (2) provide funding for the ARPA requirement to conduct direct outreach to financial aid applicants, (3) provide funding for expanded student mental health wellness program, and (4) reimbursement for relocation of the College of Health Professions Dental Hygiene program to meet required CDC and State of Arkansas guidelines to continue to teach students.

Emergency Grants to Students

UAMS intends to distribute emergency grants to current spring and summer PELL eligible students. Remaining funds authorized under the ARPA of 2021 will be distributed to PELL and non-PELL qualified student during the 2021-2022 academic year.

Spring 2021 PELL eligible students 158 – award \$200 each = \$31,600

Summer 2021 PELL eligible students 5 – award \$200 each = \$1,000

Total amount requested to award to PELL eligible students: \$32,600

Direct Outreach to financial aid applicants (required under HEERF III)

UAMS intends to conduct direct outreach to financial aid applicants regarding the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment due to the recent unemployment of a family member or independent student, or other circumstances as required under the institutional portion of the APRA of 2021.

Total estimated cost of direct outreach, including salaries, supplies and postage to 1,989 students is \$1,437,37.

Expansion of the student mental health wellness program

During the pandemic, student mental health services had significantly increased and has been a concern for all institutions of higher education. Several studies have shown there is an urgent need to develop interventions and preventive strategies to address the mental health of college students. UAMS intends to support and expand our mental health services through a certified mindfulness program for students. UAMS will develop and provide access to Koru Mindfulness courses to all students. Teachers in the program will be trained and certified in Koru Mindfulness methods.

College of Health Professions Dental Hygiene Degree Program Covid Requirements

UAMS is requesting reimbursement of costs associated with moving the College of Health Professions Dental Hygiene program to a different space to continue to teach students under the covid guidelines. In dentistry, the use of dental turbine handpieces, ultrasonic scalers, and air-water syringes general significant aerosols. For this reason, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the AR Dept of Health recommend strict adherence to masking, social distancing, and standard precautions as well as additional recommendations to minimize the possibility of disease transmission through aerosols. These additional recommendations include procedures such as pre-procedural antimicrobial rinses for patients, use of high speed evacuation, purification of the air in the treatment operatories, and allowing an operatory to "rest" between patients. This 20 – 30 minute period of non-use allows suspended aerosols to land which is then followed by surface disinfection. Moving the clinic to a larger space allowed us to spread out the dental chairs, install shielding around the operatories, and allowed faculty to continue to teach students within the mandated health guidelines, keeping students, patients, faculty and staff safe. UAMS campus operations staff was able to complete most of the renovation work in-house, which reduced cost and time for the project to be completed.

The University of Arkansas at Monticello respectfully requests review of the appropriation from the American Rescue Plan Act authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021 to provide direct emergency financial aid grants to students as well as replace an HVAC system on our technical campus in Crossett under the provisions provided by the US Department of Education.

Pursuant to the guidelines provided by the US Department of Education, the University of Arkansas at Monticello developed a formula to prioritize students with exceptional need while also allowing payments to any student that fits into the guidance release under HEERF III.

UAM's formula for determining the amount of aid a student receives is based on the enrolled students PELL status, as well as, the total number of credit hours the student is taking as of the census date. There is no application required for students to receive emergency financial aid grants. The institution relies on data received from the FAFSA to provide a quantitative method of determining need based on expected family contribution.

UAM's intent is to award 5% of our student appropriation for students taking classes this summer, 50% for students enrolled in the fall, and 45% to students enrolled in spring 2022.

This request is for FY22 and the total funding to be disbursed is \$5,176,192.

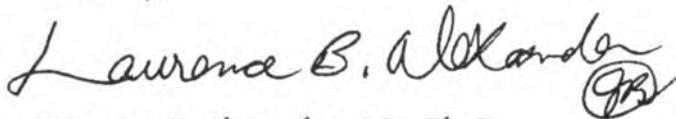

The University of Arkansas Community College at Hope-Texarkana (UACCHT) respectfully requests review of appropriation from the American Rescue Plan Act authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021 to (1) provide direct grants to students of emergency relief under the provisions provided by the U.S. Department of Education, (2) reimburse for lost revenues in auxiliary services and tuition and fees, (3) pay for technology-related expenses as they are incurred, (4) complete HVAC upgrades to improve air quality in buildings, and (5) provide additional grants to students who choose to return to UACCHT, obtain transcripts, or transfer to another institution of higher education.

This request is for the FY2022. The total funding to be disbursed or reimbursed from the Education Stabilization Fund (American Rescue Plan) for UACCHT is \$2,229,286 for the student portion and \$2,157,586 for the institutional portion; the combined total award for both grants is \$4,386,872.

- **Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students**

UACCHT intends to distribute emergency grants to students during the summer 2021, fall 2021, and spring 2022 semesters; any remaining funds will be distributed during the summer 2022 semester. During each semester, students with Pell grant eligibility will be given priority and will receive a higher grant amount than those students who are non-Pell eligible.

Maximum grant awards for the summer semester are to be provided as follows: **\$140,000**

- \$400 for Pell eligible students
- \$300 for non-Pell eligible students

Maximum grant awards for the fall and spring semesters are to be provided as follows:

- \$1,100 for full-time Pell eligible students
- \$900 for full-time non-Pell eligible students
- \$750 for part-time Pell eligible students
- \$550 for part-time non-Pell eligible students
- \$200 for concurrent students

The following totals are estimates to be awarded in each semester:

- Fall 2021 \$1,200,000
- Spring 2022 \$889,286

Total funding for the emergency grants to students \$2,229,286

University of Arkansas Community College at Batesville (UACCB) has been provided a great opportunity to support our students during the COVID-19 period through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021. UACCB submits a supplemental appropriation request for the student and institutional portions of these funds for use in FY2022.

UACCB respectfully requests a review of appropriation from ARPA to (1) provide direct grants to students for emergency relief within the provisions provided by the U.S. Department of Education, (2) make improvements to the ventilation systems of our campus facilities, and (3) enhance campus videoconferencing capabilities to further serve students.

UACCB has \$3,501,687.00 of funding available to be utilized through the Education Stabilization Fund (American Rescue Plan). In our first request we are asking for appropriations for the following expenditures:

Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students	\$1,482,175.00
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UACCB will distribute emergency grants to students during the Fall 2021 semester from the student portion of ARPA. Improvements to Campus Facility Ventilation	\$140,000.00
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In an effort to ensure healthy spaces on campus, ionization modules will be retrofitted to existing air handling units. These devices utilize ultraviolet light to sanitize the air passing through. Additionally, MERV-13 filters will be installed in all HVAC units that can fit them. MERV-13 filters have been recommended by the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE).

Replace Boiler in Independence Hall

\$120,000.00

The boiler within the largest campus meeting space, Independence Hall, has to run constantly not only for heating purposes, but in tandem with our central chiller to help pull moisture out of the air. The moisture has to be pulled out so our air can circulate better. This problem was noticed during the pandemic when the building was used for classroom space for social distancing measures. It was determined by our engineers that the pump in the boiler was not circulating the water efficiently which in return does not allow our air to circulate as it should. Having the air not circulate correctly impedes our efforts to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

Enhance Campus Videoconferencing

\$246,143.56

The move to remote learning last spring made it apparent that UACCB had needs related to technology. As a part of that realization and review, UACCB plans to enhance the campus videoconferencing technology on campus. This would equip the larger classrooms, meeting rooms, and auditorium to be connected to permanent videoconferencing, further enhancing messaging delivery and student learning through different modalities. These spaces have all been used for instruction during COVID-19.

East Arkansas Community College has received funding in the amount of \$2,970,148.00 as part of the American Rescue Plan (ARP). The U.S. Department of Education has mandated that \$1,503,264.00 is to be granted as direct student relief and the remaining \$1,466,884.00 is provided for institutional expenses related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

East Arkansas Community College's American Rescue Plan (ARP) plan includes distribution of \$1,503,264 to students through direct emergency financial aid grants in Fall 2021 and Spring 2022. Consistent with ARP requirements, students with exceptional need will be prioritized, including those qualifying for Pell Grants, and students who may be eligible for other federal or state need-based aid or have faced significant unexpected expenses, such as the loss of employment (either for themselves or their families), reduced income, or food or housing insecurity.

- \$1,000 for degree-seeking students certifying exceptional need.
- \$1,200 for Pell grant students or students enrolled in federal or state need-based aid programs. These students will be given priority in applying for and accessing grant funds.

Our detailed plan for expenditures of both the student and institutional portion of this funding during FY2022 and FY2023 are outlined below. We respectfully request a review of the appropriation from the American Rescue Plan Act to:

- 1) Provide direct aid to students for emergency relief grants under the provisions provided by the US Department of Education.
- 2) Reimburse Arkansas Northeastern College for payroll expenses related to COVID-19 related expenses.
- 3) Provide for technology-related expenses as allowed for by federal regulations.

The total funding to be disbursed or reimbursed from the Education Stabilization Fund (American Rescue Plan) for Arkansas Northeastern College is \$2,242.922 per detail below:

Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students:

Arkansas Northeastern College intends to distribute emergency grants to students during the fall and spring semesters of the 2021-2022 academic year from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. During each semester, students with Pell grant eligibility will be granted priority and will receive a higher grant amount than those who are Non-Pell grant eligible. Maximum grant awards provided during the fall and spring semesters at this time are as follows:

- \$820 per student for Pell eligible students

- \$640 per student for Non-Pell eligible students

Students will be required to complete an online certification of COVID need to receive an award.

The total funding for emergency grants to students will total \$1,179,791.

Salaries and Fringe Benefits:

Salary and fringe benefits for faculty incentives to convert current course offerings to a multimodal (live, zoom and internet) format to provide safe options for students.

The total funding for salaries and fringe benefits will total \$60,000.

Capital Outlay:

Arkansas Northeastern College will convert a total of thirty (30) rooms consisting of a combination of classrooms and laboratories to be conducive to providing course offerings in a multimodal format. The conversion will consist of purchasing software, cameras, microphones, and other technological equipment to allow students enrolled in the same course to attend live on campus, by zoom in a location of their choice or by completing the course in a traditional internet fashion. This will allow Arkansas Northeastern College to continue social distancing guidelines and provide students who may suffer adverse physical or mental effects of the pandemic the confidence of learning in a safe environment of their choosing.

The total funding for capital outlay will total \$1,003,131.

UAFS has been granted \$8.682 million dollars in direct student aid under HEERF III. UAFS requests \$5,933,250 of the HEERF III Direct Student Aid Funds for FY 2022. We will make another request under the HEERF III guidance for FY 2023 when appropriate, as we are better able to estimate the number of eligible students and the areas of exceptional need in our student population. In each major term (i.e., fall and spring), some funds are reserved for an Exceptional Need Grant process through which eligible students can document extraordinary need. Those funds will be allocated until the pool runs out. There is an application process for the Exceptional Need Grants; all other categories are awarded directly without application. Per the HEERF III allowances, the Fall 2021 process includes funds for students who were enrolled during the national Covid-19 emergency but have stopped out.

UAFS uses the following eligibility categories in its distribution plans:

- Full-time students (12-UG; 9-Graduate)
- Part-time students
- Residential students
- UG Full Pell eligible (0 EFC [Estimated Family Contribution])
- UG Partial Pell eligible (1-5280 EFC)
- UG Low-EFC (those not Pell eligible but among the closest as determined by Federal need formulas)
- Those with demonstrable exceptional need.

Our categories are not exclusive. For example, a full-time, non-residential student who has a full Pell award will receive in fall 2021 \$250 (full-time) + \$700 (Full-Pell/0 EFC) for a total of \$950. This tiering approach matches the Federal emphasis on prioritizing high need. Only small numbers of special population students are not eligible.

With the approval of the requested appropriation increase by the Arkansas Legislature, beginning in summer 2021, distribution will take place as follows:

- Fall 2021 distribution will take place in early October 2021
- Spring 2022 distribution will take place in early March 2022
- Exceptional Need grant applications will begin concurrently with distributions in the Fall and Spring.

PCCUA intends to distribute emergency grants to students during the fall, spring, and summer semesters of the 21-22 academic year from American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Any remaining grant funds will be distributed during the 22-23 academic year if available. During each semester, students with PELL grant eligibility will be granted priority and will receive a higher grant amount than those that are non-pell eligible. 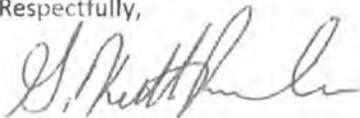

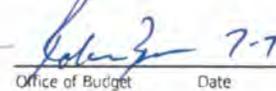

NorthWest Arkansas Community College is eligible to receive a total of \$12,037,824 in funding from the U.S. Department of education as part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

For this appropriation request, NorthWest Arkansas Community College is requesting to spend \$6,179,277 to be used solely for financial aid grants to students. If approved, the grants would be distributed to students in fall 2021 and in spring 2022 if sufficient funds are available for that semester. Our goal is to provide this additional funding to the neediest Pell grant recipients and to other needy students who may or may not qualify for Pell, but who still have significant need in order to continue their education and prepare for a career. For those students who do not qualify for Pell, there may be need based on unexpected financial circumstances, loss of employment, housing insecurity, food insecurity, the inability to afford childcare or other challenges for which assistance would be needed.

In order to meet other student needs and to provide a safe and supportive learning environment, and in accordance with the guidelines of the American Rescue Plan, NorthWest Arkansas Community College request to spend the remainder of the \$12,037,824 for additional financial aid staff, case manager, student outreach efforts, technology, reimbursement for lost revenue and for student food pantry supplies.

To be more specific, \$109,850 would be spent on two outreach specialists and an upskilling case manager to work directly with students who need to upgrade specific skills in order to retain or obtain employment. This \$109,850 would fund three positions. Because of the additional assistance needed in the financial aid area, \$25,000 would be used for a part-time person to assist with student outreach for changes in financial aid.

\$2,743,697 would be used for operating expenses, consisting of implementation of practices to monitor COVID, mailing and outreach to thousands of students for financial reconsideration, and flexible and moveable furniture (furniture under \$4,999) that would allow for more gathering spaces for students. It is important that students feel welcomed, encouraged and supported and the additional spaces will allow for students to have that opportunity as they struggle to get back on track with their education.

Approximately \$5,000 would be spent on registration, fees, and travel related to professional development for those working in student outreach, so that best practices may be learned and implemented.

Professional fees for technology and software, specific texting services for student outreach, as well as contractual services for COVID contract tracing and monitoring would require approximately \$130,000.

NorthWest Arkansas Community College also hopes to use approximately \$35,000 for capital outlay, primarily for flexible and moveable furniture for student use (furniture over \$5,000).

It is projected that NWACC will have approximately \$2,800,000 (in 2021-2022 college year) lost revenue due to lower enrollment, nonpayments and additional costs. In accordance with the guidelines of the American Rescue Plan, we are requesting this amount as lost revenue reimbursement.

Finally, as we strive to serve our students and provide them with the needed support for them to stay enrolled, we request that \$10,000 be used for supplies in the student food pantry that we have on campus. For many students, the access to healthy food is limited by their fixed living expenses.

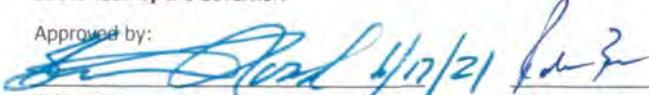

University of Arkansas Community College Morrilton respectfully requests review of appropriation from the American Rescue Plan Act authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021 for the following uses:

- Provide direct grants to students enrolled in Fall 2021 and Spring 2022 semester for emergency relief under the provisions provided by the US Department of Education
- Reimburse UACCM for payroll and fringe expenses for several positions directly related to COVID-19 needs in FY22.
- Reimburse UACCM for lost revenues from loss of enrollments, closure of campus and childcare activities and loss of community education and workforce activities during 2020 and 2021.
- Other Covid-19 Related expenses for PPE, Technology, installation of touch free devices on campus, and improving air quality for buildings on campus.
- Indirect Cost Rate of 10% as allowable per HEERF guidelines.

This request will cover some expenses and revenues that will be realized in both FY2021 and FY2022. The total funding to be disbursed or reimbursed from the Education Stabilization Fund (American Rescue Plan) for University of Arkansas Community College Morrilton is \$6,208,885. Please find attached the breakdown of expenses and lost revenues.

1. Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students to be disbursed during the Fall 2021 and Spring 2022 semesters. Students with Pell grant eligibility will be granted priority. Total funding for students totals to \$3,128,476. Maximum grant awards to be provided at this time are as follows:
 - a. Up to \$2,000 for Title IV Pell Eligible Students per term enrolled
 - b. Up to \$1,600 for Non-Title IV Pell eligible students per term enrolled

2. UACCM will continue to employ and will be hiring additional positions to supplement campus Information technology needs and enhancement of distance learning programs. The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 Institutional funds will help supplement the UACCM campus with two full time positions and up to three extra help positions totaling \$210,000. The positions are as follows:
 - a. Full time Instructional Designer
 - b. Full Time network Support Analyst
 - c. 3 Part Time Information Technology Extra Help for staff, faculty and students

3. UACCM will claim lost revenues from loss of enrollments in Summer 2020, Fall 2020, Spring 2021, loss of community education and workforce activities, and other revenues based on campus and campus childcare closures. These revenues will total up to \$275,000 pending final June revenue collections.
 - a. Summer 2020 Lost Revenues - \$53,593.25
 - b. Fall 2020 Lost Revenues - \$50,880.25
 - c. Spring 2021 Lost Revenues - \$34,788.25
 - d. Other Campus Activities lost revenues up to \$135,738.25

4. UACCM will continue to use American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 Funds to supplement current campus operations to continue to provide PPE for faculty and staff when requested, continue to purchase technology to increase communication and teaching styles to reach students, and continue to install touchless devices around campus. UACCM will also use funds to conduct mailings and other communications with students concerning the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment due to the recent unemployment of the student or family member as required by the grant and continue to follow CDC protocols for disinfecting and sanitizing and making sure the campus is equipped with all necessary materials and supplies. Expected expenses for these activities through FY22 total \$1,787,368.

5. UACCM will use funds for capital improvements in buildings across campus to improve infrastructure and air quality. These improvements are expected to total up to \$500,000.

UACCM will use the funds by claiming the allowable indirect cost rate of 10% of the total institutional portion of the grant, to reimburse the campus for operations that cannot be directly tied to the grant but are necessary for the grant to function and carry out the activities described in the grant. This helps fund utilities in buildings, extra staff costs that have job duties used for the grant and campus operations during times when the campus was both open and closed. These funds total \$308,040.90.

The current identified needs above equal \$ the total \$3,080,409 institutional portion that is currently awarded to UACCM that we plan to utilize over the next year.

Total Student Grants ARP- \$2,222,926

Southeast Arkansas College has received funding from U.S. Department of Education as part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. **\$2,222,926** is the "student" portion.

For this supplemental appropriation request, the college is requesting \$250,000 to be used for emergency financial aid grants for summer 2021 and \$1,100,000 to be used solely for emergency financial aid grants for fall 2021. Additional grants will be made in spring 2022 with remaining funds available. Specifically, \$2,222,926 would be funded from the student portion, and as needed, funds from the institutional portion may be used for student emergency financial aid grants to ensure fair and equitable distribution of funds.

The guidance accompanying the American Rescue Plan Act funds states that when making emergency financial aid grants to students, institutions receiving these funds are to prioritize students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants or are undergraduates with extraordinary financial circumstances when awarding emergency financial aid grants to students. Beyond Pell eligibility, other types of exceptional need could include students who may be eligible for other federal or state need-based aid or have faced significant unexpected expenses either for themselves or that would affect their financial circumstances, such as loss of employment, reduced income, or food or housing insecurity.

Consistent with the requirement that institutions prioritize students with exceptional need the maximum amount of emergency assistance that is provided by this grant at this time is as follows:

- \$1,000 for undergraduate students who have exceptional need such as full Pell eligible or extraordinary financial circumstances.
- \$750 for undergraduate students who are eligible for some Pell Grant funds, but not the full award.
- \$500 for undergraduate or graduate students who have need but are not eligible for Pell Grants.

There is an application process for students to request funding from this grant. The Southeast Arkansas College application process asks students to identify how the grant funds will be used. These grant funds may be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance, and for costs that have arisen due to coronavirus such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or childcare.

Consistent with the requirement that institutions prioritize students with exceptional need, the **application will open to undergraduate students with exceptional need on June 24**. To ensure priority consideration for funding, Pell eligible or extraordinary need undergraduate students should complete the application by the priority deadline date of **July 15**.

Undergraduate students who are not Pell eligible may apply beginning September 16, 2021. The deadline for all students to submit applications is 5:00 p.m., September 30, 2021. Funds will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis. Once the priority deadline has passed, all other students who are not eligible for Pell Grants may apply. Applications will be processed in the order they are received, and grants may continue to be awarded if funds remain.

State funds will not be used to replace federal funds when such funds expire, unless appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized by the Governor.

Dear Secretary Walther:

The University of Arkansas - Pulaski Technical College (UA-PTC) received official notification from the U.S. Department of Education, as part of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP), that it has been allocated \$7,728,631.00 known as the “Student Aid” portion, and \$7,725,181.00 known as the “Institutional” portion. UA-PTC is submitting this supplemental appropriation request for expenditure of the entire Student portion (\$7,728,631.00), and partial expenditure of the Institutional portion (\$424,245.00), to occur during the following terms:

- Summer of 2021;
- Fall of 2021; and
- Spring of 2022

The expenditure request is for the sole purpose of providing emergency financial aid grants for students. Specifically, the student financial aid grants are intended to be used by UA-PTC students for their cost of attendance, or for emergency costs that arise due to the coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing health care (including mental health care), or child care. Under the ARP, UA-PTC retains discretion to determine the amount and availability of the financial aid grants consistent with all applicable laws. In addition, UA-PTC is required to prioritize grants to students with exception need, such as students who receive Pell grants.

The College will model the “U.S. Department of Education’s 2021-2022 Federal Pell Grant Payment and Disbursement Schedule” to determine appropriate award amounts, while also taking into consideration the students eligibility for Pell and enrollment status. To operationalize this model, UA-PTC is requesting \$7,728,631.00 (Student portion) and \$424,245.00 (of the Institutional portion) to award emergency financial aid grants to students who are enrolled during the Summer of 2021; Fall of 2021, and Spring of 2022. The scale used to determine the grant award amount for each term is noted on page 2:

Students will receive notifications via mail, email, and text prior to the funds being electronically deposited or mailed. UA-PTC will also continue to conduct direct outreach efforts to student financial aid applicants to learn about potential loan adjustments that could be made due to recent unemployment of a family member(s) or pandemic related circumstances. These options support the College's student financial literacy efforts with the ultimate goal of reducing student loan debt.
