Arkansas Tech University has received funding from U.S. Department of Education as part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. \$11,702,936 is the "student" portion, and \$10,900,582 is the "institutional" portion.

For consideration by the May 2022 meeting of the Peer Committee and the Legislative Council, Arkansas Tech University is requesting to reallocate supplemental appropriation with no additional appropriation for an expenditure of "institutional" ARP funds that will be spent as follows:

A. Institutional Funds – HYBRID, ONLINE, HYFLEX

\$519,997 in previously allocated HEERF institutional funds will be used to provide specialized support for hybrid, online, and Hyflex course delivery. The University is requesting reallocating the previously approved salaries, benefits, student labor, and capital outlay-HVAC be moved into operating expenses to purchase classroom instructional technology upgrades to assist with the online learning initiative and the social distancing to lower the risk of the spread of COVID-19. The University is not requesting to use any additional appropriation. These expenses will support a hybrid flexible, or Hyflex course delivery model. A HyFlex course allows students the flexibility to choose their preferred method of learning based on their preferences, needs, or immediate circumstances. In sum, it is an approach that combines face-to-face and online learning. The funds requested will cover classroom instructional technology upgrades for a hybrid online/Hyflex modality. These items would defray expenses associated with the coronavirus by providing online teaching modalities in the event of having to social distance or go to online learning environment. On May 11, 2021, the U.S. Department of Education published the *Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III Frequently Asked Questions* that provide guidance on the use of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds. Question number 21 specifically addresses practices to defray expenses associated with coronavirus as follows:

21. Question: What are the allowable uses of funds for institutional uses?

Answer: Under the ARP, similar to the CRRSAA, allowable uses under the HEERF III (a)(1) Institutional Portion awards include:

- Defraying expenses associated with coronavirus (including lost revenue, reimbursement for expenses already incurred, technology costs associated with a transition to distance education, faculty and staff trainings, and payroll); and
- Making additional emergency financial aid grants to students.4

As described in Question 42, grant expenses may be incurred back to March 13, 2020, the date of the declaration of the national emergency due to the coronavirus.

Additionally, as mentioned in Question 1, the ARP has added two new required uses of HEERF III institutional portion grant funds for public and private nonprofit institutions. Namely, a portion of their institutional funds must:

- (a) implement evidence-based practices to monitor and suppress coronavirus in accordance with public health guidelines; and
- (b) conduct direct outreach to financial aid applicants about the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment due to the recent unemployment of a family member or independent student, or other circumstances, described in section 479A of the HEA.

B. Institutional Funds – INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE-RUSSELLVILLE

\$504,976 in previously allocated HEERF institutional funds will be used to upgrade and expand the information technology infrastructure capacity and coverage of Wi-Fi. The University is requesting reallocating some of the previously approved HVAC capital outlay into capital outlay technology infrastructure to provide upgrades to digital capabilities and support distance learning expansion and remote access. The University is not requesting to use any additional appropriation. The upgrades will also address: transitioning to distance classrooms, video conferencing, and other digital media necessary in providing student and staff access.

These items would defray expenses associated with the coronavirus by providing Wi-Fi and remote technologies in the event of having to social distance or go to online learning environment. On May 11, 2021, the U.S. Department of Education published the *Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III Frequently Asked Questions* that provide guidance on the use of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds. Question number 21 specifically addresses practices to defray expenses associated with coronavirus as follows:

21. Question: What are the allowable uses of funds for institutional uses?

The University of Arkansas Community College Rich Mountain respectfully requests review of appropriation received from the American Rescue Plan Act authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021. Appropriation categories needed at this time are (1) for Covid-19 related expenses for institutional resiliency and technology related expenses as allowed for by federal regulations, (2) to provide assistance to students to offset costs of attendance under provisions provided by the US Department of Education, and (3) for reimbursement for indirect costs incurred.

American Rescue Plan (ARP) Funding Plan

During the pandemic career and technical education programs across the state suffered. These programs saw a 33% decline which included over 66,000 participants. As students return to these programs DCTE *is* working diligently to utilize all resources in the most effective way to deliver high-quality, cutting-edge CTE programs and services to equip Arkansas students with the most competitive skills for future success. CTE has created a statewide playbook that includes access to high quality digital resources as an effort to support educators as they reengage all students in program areas such as: Agriculture Science and Technology, Business and Marketing Technology, Work-Based Learning, STEM, and specialized trade and industry. As enrollment in CTE courses rebounds, participation in CTE student organizations *is* increasing. Additional resources are needed to provide the exposure and access that the activities and associations that help students develop academic, technical and employability skills. Arkansas strategic plan includes goals to further develop career pathways for students, making it necessary to devote personnel to supporting Work-based learning and preapprenticeship courses for the various programs of study.

Funds will be used to redistribute state salaries in such a way to better serve career and technical programs at local schools, education cooperatives, and career centers. This restructuring of funding for state payroll will allow DCTE to identify any additional available funding in each fiscal year going forward and release those funds to local career and technical education programs.

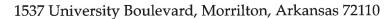

Dear Secretary Walther:

University of Arkansas Community College Morrilton respectfully requests review of appropriation from the American Rescue Plan Act authorized in Section 38 of Act 997 of 2021 for the following uses:

- Extension of ARPA Funds as authorized by the federal government from May 14th, 2022 to June 30, 2023.
- Revise previously submitted requests to align with additional capital needs, student aid payments and additional lost revenues realized by UACCM during fiscal year 2022.
- Request additional approval of supplemental funding of CFDA# 84.425M through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund – Strengthening Institutions Program

This request will cover some expenses and revenues that will be realized in both FY2022 and FY2023. The total funding included in these requests to be disbursed or reimbursed from the Education Stabilization Fund (American Rescue Plan) for University of Arkansas Community College Morrilton is \$267,326. Please find attached the breakdown of expenses and lost revenues.

- 1. For the institutional portion of the ARPA Funds, UACCM requests to revise the extension date to June 30, 2023 as allowed by the Department of Education and revise the original funding amounts as follows:
 - a. Reduce Regular Salaries by \$35,124 due to inability to hire a full-time instructional designer during Fiscal Year 2022
 - b. Reduce Extra Help Salaries by \$40,000 due to decreased needs during Fiscal Year 2022 that was not covered by current full-time staff
 - c. Reduce Personal Services Matching by \$25,000 due to the reduced extra help positions and not hiring an instructional designer during fiscal year 2022.
 - d. Reducing Operating Expenses \$400,000 due to capital HVAC needs and identifying additional lost revenues during fiscal year 2022.
 - e. Increasing Capital Outlay \$113,000 due to capital HVAC Needs
 - f. Increasing Grant payments to students \$52,124.
 - g. Increase lost revenue reimbursement \$335,000 for additional lost revenues identified from Summer 2021, Fall 2021, Spring 2022 terms.
- 2. UACCM is seeking approval for the request of supplemental funding of CFDA# 84.425M through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Strengthening Institutions Program
 - a. UACCM will use the funds by claiming the allowable federal indirect cost rate of 10% of the total institutional portion of the grant, to reimburse the campus for operations that cannot be directly tied to the grant but are necessary for the grant to function and carry out the activities described in the grant. This helps fund utilities in buildings, extra staff costs that have job duties used for the grant and campus operations during times when the campus was both open and closed. These funds total \$26,732.
 - b. UACCM has identified additional operating expenses that will supplement current campus operations to continue to provide PPE and cleaning supplies for faculty and staff and purchase technology needs for the campus. These funds total \$60,594.
 - c. UACCM will use the final \$180,000 for HVAC capital needs to upgrade campus infrastructure and air quality.

The Arkansas workforce, as many in the nation, has struggled to maintain adequate staffing in its 24-hour facilities providing services to seriously mentally ill adults and seriously emotionally disturbed children and adolescents during these times of high Covid numbers. Hardships encountered due to this struggle include staff working many extra shifts with little opportunity for self-care, delays in admitting and discharging individuals to and from behavioral health treatment facilities/programs awaiting COVID-19 testing, and the resultant burn-out of staff working extra shifts and covering additional duties.

To address these issues the following plan is proposed:
