Pursuant to the provisions of Section 34 of Act 285 of 2014, Arkansas Tech University (ATU) requests a transfer of cash appropriation from the DFA Cash Fund Holding Account to the ATU Cash Operations appropriation for FY2015 operating expense commitment item 502:00:02, Fund 2100000, Funds Center B11 in the amount of \$ 1,840,155.

The current year usage of our maintenance and operations commitment item indicates a shortage of appropriation by year end. We are requesting additional appropriation to cover expenses for operations through June 30, 2015.

The increased operational costs that have resulted in this request are:

Re: Cash Letter - State Veterans' Home at Fayetteville / Operating Expenses, Professional Fees, Regular Salaries, Personal Services Matching

Dear Mr. Sharp:

We respectfully request \$275,000 additional FY15 cash appropriation for Fayetteville Veterans Home operating expenses, \$225,000 additional FY15 cash appropriation for professional fees; and \$100,000 each in regular salaries and personal services matching. These increases will cover remaining FY15 expenditures in these categories and provide a small appropriation margin through year end.

Fayetteville resident census has increased 21% during FY15; revenues have increased 14% and expenditures have decreased 5% this fiscal year. We project a ~\$475,000 excess of revenues over expenses through June 30, 2015 for the Fayetteville Veterans Home. On an accrual basis, FY15 monthly expenditures average \$620,000 against average monthly revenues of \$665,000.

We project that we will expend an additional \$610,000 in commitment item 502:00:02 through June 30, 2015 against a current available budget of only \$373,161 (\$1,707,499 expended FYTD), leaving an appropriation deficit of \$237,000. The largest expenditures in this commitment item are contract food service, rent, drugs and medicines, bed tax, health lab supplies, food purchases and misc, tech services.

Including this \$275,000 budget Increase request, total FY15 appropriation for this commitment item is 14% less than in FY14, or \$2,324,538 vs. \$2,701,538 in FY14.

We estimate that we will incur an additional \$210,000 in FY15 professional fees against an available budget of only \$2,503 (\$277,497 expended FYTD). Professional fees are comprised of medical diagnostic & lab fees, medical director and doctor's visit fees, therapy service fees and fees paid to the third-party medical biller. Invoices from the therapy service provider, our largest expense in this category, have been delayed, causing FYTD posted (cash basis) expenses to be understated through Period 9.

Professional fees are directly related to resident census level and resident acuity level. The number of 70% service-connected disabled residents (high acuity) has increased 70% during FY15 (an average of 18.25 residents per month vs. 10.75 during FY14). Overall resident census has increased 21% during FY15. These two factors have significantly increased costs in this expense category.

We project that we will end the year with \$27,000 in regular salaries budget remaining. However, we are requesting \$100,000 in additional regular salaries appropriation as a cushion in the event that merit honuses are approved or we must hire additional nursing staff to maintain minimum staffing requirements between now and year-end.

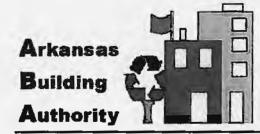
We project that we will end the year with a \$56,000 deficit in personal services matching budget if merit bonuses are approved this fiscal year and a \$36,000 deficit if they are not approved. We are requesting \$100,000 in additional personal services matching appropriation, slightly higher than our projections, as a cushion related to minimum staffing requirements.

Dear Mr. Walther:

Please accept this letter as a request for additional appropriation for the above referenced Cash Fund Account (D17) for the Justice Building Construction Fund (1320200). Arkansas Building Authority requests a debt service appropriation increase of \$1,200,000 for commitment item #5120019 for FY15.

The appropriation increase will allow our agency to work with the Arkansas Development Finance Authority (ADFA) to accomplish a bond refunding for the Series 2005 issue for the State Agencies Facilities Revenue Refunding in a debt service reduction for the Supreme Court / Justice Building. The refunding will allow the ADFA to utilize cash funds escrowed in the debt service reserve fund along with favorable market conditions to significantly reduce the remaining debt on the 2005 Series. As to be expected, time is of the essence and ADFA is preparing to proceed with the refunding as soon as appropriate approvals are in place with a target refunding around June 1⁸¹.

Dear Mr. Sharp,

The Arkansas History Commission (AHC), an agency of the Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism, is requesting permission to increase our Cash Fund Appropriation to accommodate a major grant recently awarded by the Arkansas Humanities Council, and a minigrant we anticipate funding from the Arkansas Humanities Council within the week.

The two grants will be used for expenses related to the agency's educational and public programming in 2015-2016. One of the grants provides funding for one of our agency's three extra help positions. Our general revenue appropriation is usually not sufficient to allow us to fill all three of these positions for a full fiscal year.

I am requesting the following increases in our FY2015 cash fund in fund NPT0201, Fund Center 955 and Business Area 0915: an increase of \$15,000 to Operating Expenses Commitment Item 02; an increase of \$300 in Conference & Travel Expenses Commitment Item 09; and an increase of \$3000 in Professional Fees Commitment Item 10.

Additionally, because these grants involve funding for extra help, I need to request the addition of an Extra Help Commitment Item 01 in fund NPT0201, Fund Center 955 in the amount of \$8000; and a Personal Services Matching Commitment Item 03 in Fund NPT0201, Fund Center 95S in the amount of \$2250.

A revised Certification of Income with the additional revenue will be provided for this appropriation increase, and I ask that you place the request on the PEER Committee's May 2015 agenda.
