Amend Senate Bill No. 122 as originally introduced:

Page 31, delete SECTION 47 in its entirety and substitute the following:

- "SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

  OLMSTEAD FEE AND ADMINISTRATIVE FEE PAYMENT RESTRICTIONS AND REPORTING REQUIREMENT. (i) Funds appropriated by this Act, fund balances or any funding sources of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall not be utilized to pay, reimburse, pay administrative charges or pay any fees to another State agency for the State's Olmstead plan or for the administration of the Medicaid Disproportionate Share (DSH) program.
- (ii) The Department of Human Services may charge the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences an administrative fee percentage for processing other Medicaid supplemental payments that is no more than 3.75%.
- (iii) The Department of Human Services shall submit a report by May 31 of each year for certification by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee to ensure the Department of Human Services follows the requirements of this Section, which shall include the administrative charges or fees which the Department of Human Services has charged to all participating entities, including the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, for Medicaid supplemental payments for the last completed fiscal year, including the amounts and administrative charges or fees which the Department of Human Services will charge to all participating entities for Medicaid supplemental payments for the next fiscal year, including the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, including the amounts and administrative fee percentage.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020."

Page 18, insert the following SECTIONS immediately following SECTION 28 to read as follows:

SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 23, Chapter 61, Subchapter 8, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

23-61-809. Restrictions on State Insurance Department.

The State Insurance Department shall not:

- (1) Apply for or accept any funds, including without limitation federal funds, for the purpose of advertisement, promotion, or other activities designed to promote or encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or the Arkansas Works Program;
- (2) Utilize more than one (1) navigator entity to fulfill the program standards required under 45 CFR § 155.210;
- (3) Utilize a guide, certified application counselor, or certified licensed producer under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide, and Certified Application Counselors Act, § 23-64-601 et seq.; or
- (4) Contract with another state agency or political subdivision to perform any prohibited practice under this section, § 23-64-610(a), or any other law relating to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or the Arkansas Works Program.

- SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 23-64-602, concerning definitions within the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide, and Certified Application Counselors Act, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:
- (18)(A) "Gift" means a gift item, gift card, cash card, cash, or promotional item that markets or promotes the products or services of a third party.
- (B) "Gift" does not include the reimbursement of legitimate expenses incurred by a consumer in an effort to receive application assistance, such as travel or postage expenses.
- SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 23-64-610(a), concerning prohibited activities of a licensee under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide, and Certified Application Counselors Act, is amended to read as follows:
  - (a) Except for a certified licensed producer, a licensee shall not:
- (1) Receive compensation directly or indirectly from any health insurer:
- (2) Engage in an activity that requires licensing as a residential insurance producer under the Producer Licensing Model Act, § 23-64-501 et seq.; or
- (3) Recommend a particular plan or advise consumers about which plan to choose;
- (4) Charge any applicant or enrollee, or request or receive any form of remuneration from or on behalf of an applicant or enrollee, for application or other assistance related to licensee duties;
- (5) Provide to an applicant or potential enrollee a gift of any value as an inducement to enroll in the Arkansas Works Program, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, or any other health benefit plan;
- (6) Use Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace funds to purchase a gift with the intent to give the gift to an applicant or potential enrollee;
- (7) Solicit any consumer for application or enrollment assistance by going door-to-door or through other means of direct contact, including calling a consumer to provide application or enrollment assistance without the consumer initiating the contact, unless the licensee has a pre-

<u>existing relationship with the consumer and complies with other applicable</u> <u>state</u> and federal laws; or

(8) Initiate a telephone call to a consumer using an automatic telephone dialing system or an artificial or prerecorded voice technology, except in cases in which the licensee has a relationship with the consumer and complies with other applicable state and federal laws."
