Title IX

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 ("Title IX") provides that no person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. 20 U.S.C. §1681.

Title IX provides that discrimination on the basis of sex includes sexual harassment of students, as well as sexual violence.

SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

OBTAINING INFORMATION, SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE, FILING A COMPLAINT



UCA defines the term sexual misconduct as any unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature, including any conduct or act of a sexual nature perpetrated against an individual without consent. Sexual misconduct can be committed by men or by women, and it can occur between people of same or different sex. Sexual misconduct includes but is not limited to: dating violence; domestic violence; sexual assault (nonconsensual sexual contact and non-consensual intercourse); sexual harasament; and stalking. Your decision to report to the police will not affect your ability to file a complaint through the university's procedures, which are independent of the criminal process. TITLE IX COORDINATOR

PROTECTIVE ORDER

If you obtain external orders of protection (e.g. restraining orders, injunctions, protection from abuse), please notify the UCA Police Department or the campus Title IX Coordinator so that those orders can be observed

FILING A COMPLAINT



You are not required to file a report immediately. However, it is important to preserve any evidence of the incident. Local options for medical care include the UCA Student Health Center and Conway Regional Medical Center. For your safety and well-being, immediate medical attention is encouraged. If you choose to have an evidence collection kit completed, it is important to be examined as soon as possible, ideally within

INSTITUTIONAL COMPLAINT

Faculty members, staff members, students or third parties who are participating in a university-sponsored program, who believe they have been subjected to sexual misconduct, should report the incident promptly to their immediate supervisor, academic dean, departmental supervisor, or directly to the Title IX Coordinator, a Deputy Title IX Coordinator, General Counsel or Associate Vice President for Human Resources. Individuals may also utilize the Sexual Misconduct Complaint Form found on the university's website to make a report.

The person to whom the complaint is made shall immediately contact the Title IX Coordinator. In conducting the informal investigation and resolution, the Title IX Coordinator will utilize the university Sexual Misconduct Grievance Procedures, which may be found on the university website. The department involved and/or the supervisor to whom the complaint was made may be asked to assist in the informal investigation.

CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

You are not required to file a criminal complaint. However, if you choose to, you may file by contacting the police. A criminal complaint is governed by applicable criminal statutes.

UCA is committed to responding to sexual misconduct and is required by federal law to investigate all allegations and take any remedial action deemed necessary to preserve your safety and that of our community.
